I vividly remember sitting here this time last year writing about the New Year. I brought to that space a desire to let go of 2018 and move into 2019 with renewed hope for our country and world. It's strange that I find myself in the same mental and emotional space. Last year, our country was polarized over its politics. It doesn't feel like we've drifted any closer to unity; rather it feels like we keep going in the opposite direction. Last year I feel like there was very personal pain to lament and grieve and a desire to move on into the New Year, however, the New Year brought different pain and grief and the desire to move away from it into newness is prevalent again.

How can this be? How can I be sitting here wishing for the exact same thing as last year? Isn't the New Year about moving into newness? While each year brings its own hardships and joys, at least we can say they're both new. So why does this feel so much like the same?

I have no idea what you're feeling right now. I don't know if you're struggling with the same tired feelings I am or if you've been able to move into that renewed hope that the New Year often brings. If you're struggling, I want to offer some insight I've received.

Therapy has taught me to let go of a "fix-it" approach to life, at least when things seem overwhelming and that encroaching need to control steps in. It's been one of the most difficult and yet most liberating growths I've experienced. When that fix-it mentality is gone, I'm able to see what is present instead of being so focused on past pains and future controls. Because I'm not so focused on the outcome I want, I'm able to hold in balance both the positives and negatives around me.

This lends to an interesting insight: we don't need to allow positive and negative experiences consume all of our attention. We can allow both to exist at the same time, knowing that the negative will not destroy us because the positive is right there, we just weren't able to see it before. And when I can hold those two experiences in balance, I'm not so dependent on expectations being met, but can be flexible when life decides to laugh at the planning I've done.

This takes time. Even as I'm sharing this I have that tired feeling of moving into the New Year feeling like the stuff I hoped for is still the stuff I'm hoping for. So I have to sit back and see the beauty and the love that did happen. While the pain of those we've lost is still there, the comfort we've experienced in each other and the presence of their memories are still here. While we've gone through some financial anxieties, we are an ever-expanding church, both in numbers involved and ministries expressed. While the country seems divided and fearful and while those feelings leak into our own fabrics, we embrace the future with love, courage, creativity, and togetherness. And as I sit, reflecting on this feeling of sameness, writing about renewed love and hope in one another and through our church, I'm reminded that what I was hoping for all along was right there, I just wasn't able to see it before.

As we enter into this new year, my prayer is not that resolutions will come true. Anne Lamott has a profound quote: Expectations are regrets under construction. Expectation can serve as positive reinforcement when it used as hope, but it can quickly turn into painful regret when it's not met. Rather, my prayer is that our eyes can be opened to the love, community, compassion, and hope this is already around us – that we simply weren't able to see before.



NEW SPEAKER ADDED! Hillary McBride will now be joining Michael Gungor and William Matthews at the Solvang Folk School Talks /FM Lecture Series this February.

Pastor Chris Brown has invited these hosts of the Liturgists Podcast, one of the top religious podcasts in the country, to come to Bethania. The Liturgists are a global community working to subvert the barriers our society builds around religion, race, gender, ability, and sexuality. Their work is centered around compelling discussion, non-judgmental community, and thoughtful, evocative art. www.theliturgists.com.



MICHAEL GUNGOR is one half of Gungor, and is a co-host of *The Liturgists Podcast*. Michael is a Grammy nominated musician and composer. He leads the musical collective Gungor with his wife Lisa Gungor and is a co-founder of The Liturgists with Mike McHargue ('Science Mike').

In his latest book, *This: Becoming Free*, Gungor shares the deconstruction of his faith and the transformation of it as another story. Letting go of the stories that defined his identity and value in the world led Gungor and his family on a wild and painful journey through atheism, mysticism, betrayal, loss, medical issues,

and thousands of online trolls. Through personal story, parable, philosophy, physics, and absurdity, Gungor shows us that who we think we are is an illusion, a constriction of reality that creates suffering in our lives.

Michael Gungor and his wife Lisa live in Los Angeles, California with their two daughters.

WILLIAM MATTHEWS was born in the city of Detroit and raised in Raleigh NC. His father and grandfather before him a preacher and his mother a social worker & church choir director. William is known around the world as a singer songwriter and popular recording artist who for the past decade has extensively toured and performed all across the U.S, Europe, Australia, South Africa, Brazil & Asia. During that time William wrote and performed many popular songs that appeared on several Bethel Music compilations, many of which debuted at number 1 or highly charted on Billboard including his first record Hope's Anthem. His songs are sung in churches all over the world.



William's passion is artistry and advocacy. During the 2016 election William joined the Not Who We Are campaign. He filmed a short music documentary entitled "Your Voice Matters" showcasing Detroit & his family's roots in the black church, which was highlighted by media entities like CNN & Yahoo News. William also serves on the board of environmental advocacy group Micah Challenge. He currently resides in Los Angeles and recently finished his much anticipated sophomore record.



DR. HILLARY MCBRIDE is a Registered Clinical Counsellor in private practice in Vancouver who recently completed her PhD candidate in Counselling Psychology at University of British Columbia. During her doctoral studies, Hillary continued the research she started in her Masters: exploring women's relationships with their bodies, particularly when women feel comfortable and appreciative of their own bodies. Her areas of clinical and research specialty focus on the intersection of spirituality and mental health, trauma and trauma therapies, embodiment, eating disorders, body image, sex and sexuality, and feminist approaches to psychology. She was awarded the international Young Investigators Award for her work in human sexuality, and recently published her first book with Post Hill Press entitled "Mothers, daughters, and body image: Learning to love ourselves as we are". Hillary's research has been recognized by the American Psychological Association, the Canadian Psychological Association, and the

Government of Canada.

Hillary's work is deeply personal, and informed by how she has both experienced and observed women's struggles to embrace themselves and their bodies, as they are, in all stages of life. "I love to help see people grow, heal, change, and come into more fullness in themselves and their relationships," she states. "I want to make psychology and empirical research about well-being accessible to a wide variety of people."

What is the Value of Educating Girls?

Thanks to your donations to Piyali Scholarships since 2012, Rekha Mistry, then a kindergartener, is now 13 and in 6th grade. \$375/year has provided tuition, books and school supplies, uniforms, nutritional meals, health care. Her favorite subject is Social Studies. See her letter on the Parish Hall bulletin board where she wrote about recent study of diversity – an important issue in India as well as the U.S.

Rekha has already far surpassed the little or no education available to her mother. She is on track to complete 8th grade at Piyali Learning Center for Girls in a village outside Mumbai. She may have the opportunity to attend high school. She is not being forced into early marriage or being sold into trafficking by her family. When she does begin working and when she marries, her education will enable better employment and the ability to nurture a healthy family.

During January and February, BLCW is sponsoring fundraising for the 2020 Piyali Center scholarships. Again this year, our goal is to raise \$1,275.

Elementary School Scholarships:

- *Rekha's scholarship (\$375)
- *Bidisha scholarship (\$375, 6 years old and in her first year.)

Literacy/Vocational Training Program Scholarships (18 months-2 years, young women)

- *Kalidar's scholarship (\$175, married as child, 2 children, no opportunity for education, 2nd year, literacy)
- *Soma's scholarship (\$175), married, in 1st year year, learning tailoring
- *Lakshmi's scholarship (\$175), married, 2 children, daughter in Piyali School, 1st year, when younger not able to continue studies because of parent illness.)

Bethania has Angels as Members

Thank you to all of our Christmas Angels who helped with the gifts for our 70 Iglesia children and the 3 Preschool/After School children. This was a large Christmas Angel event, with all of these children to shop for, and I am so proud to say that Bethania members and friends once again stepped up to this challenge.

The members of Iglesia Luterana are primarily of indigenous Oaxacan descent; most do not speak English but may be able to get by with some Spanish, as their primary language is a native dialect. The pastor communicates in Spanish and those who speak only the indigenous dialect(s) have the Spanish translated to their language by others. They attend a start-up church located on the premises of Bethel Lutheran Church in Santa Maria. The parents of these children struggle during the off-season months to have enough food for their families and other necessities. Christmas presents are non-existent for the majority of these children.

We worked with Pastor Esteban and his wife Angie to try to fill the children's "wish lists". We were "Christmas Angels" to children of both genders, ranging in age from newborns to age 16. The presents were wrapped and delivered to the church in three vehicles for distribution to the children. The joy of the children and the gratitude of their parents is overwhelming, as the only gift that most of them will get was from our "angels".

We also supported some local families whose children attend our own Bethania Preschool and After School Program with gifts. These families are our neighbors who are struggling with their financial challenges. The three children were chosen by Director Eileen Knotts for assistance this Christmas season. We are very happy to be able to help some children who are attending our wonderful program based here at Bethania.

We encouraged people of all ages and abilities to participate. All sizes of monetary donations were given, ranging from spare change to \$200. We promoted the concept of "we can do the shopping for you" so that people who did not have the time or were physically unable to go shopping could participate. Thankfully we had many wonderful people agree to shop for their "adopted" child, which really helped with the task.

The meeting was graciously hosted by Carol Lake and Marilyn Larsen at their home where all members shared a holiday meal.

Council members received a report from the Social Ministry Committee Chair, Linda Marzullo, and the Farstrup-Mortensen Committee Chair, Donna Hinsbeeck, as part of the on-going program of inviting committee chairs to make presentations about their committees to the church council.

Council members present discussed a variety of topics including:

Treasurer's Report For November 2019

Balance Sheet:

The cash balance in the operating account has improved over last month, with \$2,541 in the account after all bills were paid.

The money market has once again has gone down due to cash being used for capital improvements.

The result has been an increase in the fixed assets of the church and its properties.

The church has no indebtedness, and all accounts are current and all liabilities have been paid. The only exception is the pension liability.

The total assets of the church are \$3,751,788.

Profit & Loss, Budget Performance:

Income:

Other income is up for the month due to the youth fund income from the rummage sale that was held in November. Income for the month was up by \$2,645

Offerings were down by \$3,383 for the month, but were on budget for the first 11 months. Of particular note is the increase in non-member giving – it is at 160% of budget.

Other receipts were up for the month and were at 123% of budget for the first 11 months.

Child care reimbursements were on budget for the first 11 months of the year.

Total income for the month was slightly below budget by \$581.

Expenses:

Salary and benefits were slightly below the budget for the month (\$607 below), but are over for the first 11 months at 103%

Staff expenses were below budget for the month and for the first 11 months.

Office administration expenses were over budget.

Property expenses were below budget for the month, but continue to be over for the first 11 months.

Utilities were up slightly for the month, and also for the first 11 months.

All other expenses were at or below budget for the year to date.

Overall, our expenses were \$3,850 over income for the month, and \$14,000 for the year to date.
