I want to thank everyone for helping with the Brown Bag Breakfasts on Sunday. I know we are doing God's work. We are helping people keep healthy.

I also thank those of you who helped today with the Emergency Food Distribution (going on now as I type). Several people were in line already at 3:15 pm when I left the premises. There is a big need right now. We are serving the members of our community by providing this service.

While nothing ever goes completely smoothly, we really do a great job. Both the BBBs and the Emergency Food Distribution are a work of love, service, cooperation and efficiency. Each of us is helpful and supportive to the greater good. Today we unloaded the food, put it on tables, and adapted our own ways of packing up the groceries. Well done, everyone! We were also able to use 12 boxes of fresh produce from Veggie Rescue and make about 50? smaller bags.

We are blessed as a church - Bethania has the facilities for production and storage, tables, parking lots (to drive in and out), staff, volunteers, communication - Facebook, email, connection to other community members (like the schools, etc) and the ability to organize and help. As we know, "it ain't our first rodeo."

I close with a passage from Ephesians " ¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up."

I sincerely value and appreciate each and everyone of you. When we all lift together the load is lighter.

Brown Bag Senior Breakfast Packing Day is coming:

Sunday, May 3 at 11:00 am

Mark your calendar to help us pack brown bag breakfast items for needy local seniors on Sunday, May 3 at 11:00 a.m. We are meeting a little later so you can participate in the online worship service with Pastor Chris.

We will be practicing social distancing and CDC recommended guidelines. You will need to wear a mask and follow sanitation guidelines. If you have been sick AT ALL for the past 7 days, please do not come. If you are in the high risk category, please do not come.

Our little brown bags are for SYV seniors who need to take medications in the morning with food, and would otherwise have nothing to eat with their pills due to financial constraints or physical limitations. Currently we are helping between 70 and 85 local seniors with breakfast bags three times a week, which means we need a minimum of approx. 840 bags per month. This ministry continues to be a vital need for our area.

You can also help out by donating any of the following items. The church is open daily from 9-5 and you can drop off items inside. Or, you can drop them on the packing day.

- Protein Drinks (such as Ensure or Atkins)
- Soft Granola/Cereal Bars
- Protein Bars
- Oatmeal Packets (Protein type)
- Instant Cup of Soup/Lunch or Noodles
- Fruit Cups or Applesauce
- Pudding (non-refrigerated)
- Small Juice Boxes or Plastic Bottles of Fruit Juices (such as Apple, Cranberry, Orange)

A big THANK YOU to the recent donation from The Bert R. Cohen Family Foundation. Special thanks also to the Kei Lin Foundation for supporting us with their grant and to Betty Madsen for her donation. These grant funds and your donations will be purchasing the Brown Bag Breakfast items for the next packing, but we still encourage and need your donations.

Emergency Food Distribution Site at Bethania *Tuesdays, 4-6 pm Drive up and Walk up*

Bethania is operating as an Emergency USDA Food Distribution site during the pandemic. We receive food deliveries from SB County FoodBank at 10 am each Tuesday, which we then sort and bag for families. We also have received some fresh vegetables through Veggie Rescue. In addition, we have received kind donations from generous neighbors and businesses.

Distribution is through drive up or walk up, from 4-6 pm. There are no restrictions on income or family size at this time.

This is an incredibly rewarding and emotional experience for many. All of us try to be kind, compassionate and loving to those who come to our site. We have had many joyful moments as well. From sharing tears with someone who is struggling, to watching a little boy dance with Mickey Mouse (Bridget Cassara), it has been a blessing to be able to help our neighbors through our church and FoodBank.

If you would like to help, please contact me. We need about 22-24 people in the mornings and 16-18 people in the afternoons. Too many people makes it difficult for us all to be safe, unfortunately. This is why we really need people to sign up in advance. Anyone interested in attending should let me know by 3:00 pm Monday (the day before the distribution).

We practice COVID-19 safety procedures and have strict guidelines we must follow or risk being shut down. If you have been sick in any way in the previous 7 days, you cannot come to help. Additionally, if you are in a risk category, please do not come and endanger yourself. Please be aware that we are moving a lot of heavy canned items from pallets and into bags. Hard work, but so rewarding!

When you receive this Beacon, we will have completed our 6th week of Emergency Food Distribution. Every week the number of people who need are help has increased. We ask for your prayers and support for this challenging mission.

Church Business

Council Highlights from the April 2020 Meeting

The April 2020 monthly Council meeting was held at 7:00 pm on April 16, 2020. Members present were Emily Abello, Wendy Bevier, Josh Bratt, Pastor Chris, Stewart Fries, Lynne Hemming, Carol Lake, Lori McConnell, Carolyn Schuit, and Anne Twigg. Jeanelle Needham was not present. Ron Walsh was also present at the meeting.

The April 2020 Council meeting was again conducted via Zoom Conference technology.

The Pastor provided an update on the actions taken by the church in response to the Covid-19 outbreak, including:

- Live Stream Services
- Food Distribution on Tuesdays
- New Blessing Box
- Deacon program
- Midweek Updates
- Theology Pub on virtual media

Ron Walsh, Business Manager for the church and Lori McConnell, Treasurer gave a presentation on the church's financial position through April 15, 2020, including weekly giving, endowment funding and an SBA loan/grant application submitted to Montecito Bank. They reported that expenses were being closely managed and that member and non-member giving had been greater than expected in view of the suspension of church gatherings.

The council also discussed:

- New signers on Montecito Bank checking account
- Endowment Funding in case of shortfall

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 21, 2020.

Treasurer's Report March 2020 Financial Statements

Balance Sheet:

- Cash position is relatively good at \$4,890; money market funds are primarily designated funds, with the exception of \$4,962 that is available to the church for general fund usage.
- Major change to balance sheet is pension liability when Pastor Chris was called, his letter of call stipulated that a housing equity fund be set up for him; it was to be 3%; we assumed that the money was being deposited monthly to Portico (the church benefits program); we recently

discovered that it had not been done; the bookkeeper calculated the past due amount (approximately \$8,500) and that has been added as a liability in account 2200 (bottom of page 1 of the balance sheet).

Profit & Loss Budget Performance:

Income:

- Under other income, Laurel, there was an error in the budget for 2020; the yearly amount should be \$21,600; that is being adjusted for next month.
- Fundraising was down, as were facilities use receipts.
- Monthly offerings were up by \$2,085 (that is the first time this year), but still are below the year to date by \$4,000.
- Total income for the month was up slightly, but below budget for the first three months.
- For the month of March we experienced a deficit of \$1,047. Considering our current situation, that is encouraging it could have been much worse!
- The Endowment Committee has made \$10,000 available for us to cover upcoming expenses. This money will be spent only if necessary.
- As an aside the offering income for April so far has shown an increase over the budget.

Expenses:

- Expenses were well controlled for the month, with salaries & benefits below budget (partially due to Livier being on leave, but her leave finished mid-March), office administration below budget for the month, maintenance on budget, utilities on budget, and all other expenses at or below budget.
