### Pastor Chris's Message

Two things have hit me this week in a visceral way: The first is that we aren't going back to the way things were before the pandemic—and there are feelings attached to that, which I'm still processing. However, the second thing that hit me viscerally is that whatever the new normal becomes, it's not the end of the world.

I can still place myself in that mental space of March 2020 when we first shut down and thinking this is going to be a few weeks, we'll be worshipping together for Easter, and then we'll move past this. I remember at that time that getting back to the way things were seemed not only plausible, but likely. That gave way over the next few months to simply wondering what we're coming back to. Now that we are in the process of reopening, both publicly and at Bethania, it's setting in that we're coming back to a different world. But different isn't necessarily bad.

It's hard for me to not think in terms of Bethania and our church life because this is my career, but I imagine for all of you this reality might bear meaning in many other facets of your life, whether it's your own personal career fields, relationships, routines, etc. I can't speak for anyone but myself, and thus cannot say authoritatively that because it's a new world it's going to be okay for everyone. I know there's a lot of pain and struggle as we come out of this time. I feel a lot of that myself in many ways and I'm trying to navigate it as best I can.

I guess what I'm saying is that there's some comfort in acknowledging that we're not going back to the way things were, that there will be a new normal and just like with this pandemic, we'll adapt. I think I knew this intellectually—I think I've even written a Beacon article about acknowledging this, but it hit me viscerally this last week at our first Unorthodox Gathering and talking, as a community, about how different we are, our expectations are, and how different the world seems. And you know, sitting there with a community of people made it feel like this visceral revelation isn't the end of the world, and that somehow felt like a positive thing.

Mulling in my head this week has been Jesus' final words in the Gospel of Matthew, "And remember, I will be with you always, to the end of the age." That's what I feel as I've gathered with you all in worship at our 9:30 service and at Unorthodox. I think because physically gathering had been missing for so long, that gathering now, even though it's a different world, just feels like Jesus is with me, and right now, that just feels like a positive thing.

## **Brown Bag Senior Breakfast Packing: July 11th**

Our fifth 2021 socially distanced Brown Bag Breakfast packing day is now scheduled for July 11th. We will be packing in the courtyard area around 10:45.

The bags we make up are intended to provide items for local seniors to eat while taking medications. Usually our bags are used for breakfast meds and to guarantee a morning meal, afternoon snack or sometimes a late evening or midnight snack as one of the recipients let us know. Our breakfast bags are delivered three times a week.

The church is open daily (usually from 9-5) and you can drop off any donated items you would like inside or at the church office, in addition to bringing items to us on packing day. You can also make a donation and earmark it "Brown Bag Breakfasts" so we can go do the shopping. Any and all help is much appreciated.

- Protein Drinks (such as Ensure or Atkins)
- Soft Granola/Cereal Bars
- Protein Bars
- Oatmeal Packets (Protein type)
- Instant Cup of Soup/Lunch or Noodles
- Fruit Cups or Applesauce
- Pudding (non-refrigerated)
- Small Juice Boxes or Plastic Bottles of Fruit Juices (such as Apple, Cranberry, Orange)

Every item you donate, every dollar you contribute, goes directly to helping a local senior.

## Food Distribution Continues

For the month of July, Food Distribution continues through the month until the last week. **Food Distribution will NOT BE HELD on July 27<sup>th</sup> (the last Tuesday of the month).** The Food Distribution will resume on August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Please be aware that during this week we may need additional donations at the Blessing Box to help out those who rely on our assistance.

Our June numbers showed that we are currently serving over 600 unique households.

Bethania's Emergency USDA Food Distribution site is usually every Tuesday from 5:15-6:45 pm. Distribution is through drive up or walk up line. There are no restrictions on income or family size at press time. We serve people from all walks of life, and in all types of circumstances.

**We can always use donations of protein items (canned chicken, tuna, macaroni & cheese, peanut butter) and staples such as canned vegetables, pasta and sauce, jelly, honey, cereal, soup and chili.** Donations can be left in the church, at the church office or you can contact me to drop off items. **We also distribute diapers and wipes, along with incontinence and feminine hygiene items.** Donations of any of these products are greatly appreciated.

If you would like to help, please contact me. We appreciate and value every volunteer who assists us with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough. We need people to set up and pack some of the items in the morning at 10:30 and then another crew to help pack the bags and sort produce after 1:45. Unloading/moving helpers can come at 9:30 or 1:30. The evening distribution needs people who can lift heavy items and put things into cars, so if you are able to help, we would love to have you.

We continue to need your prayers and support for this mission, which is making a difference in so many lives here in our area.

## Noisy Sunday - July 25: Items for Kits

The next "Noisy Sunday" is coming on July 25<sup>th</sup>. Our "joyful noise" will be helping to send a child to school. In many countries, the family must provide all the items needed to attend school: paper, ruler, pencils, pens, etc.

It is incredible to think about how we can change someone's life by providing pens, pencils and paper. Or how we can help someone keep healthy by providing a bar of soap and a towel. These are small things that add up to a much larger picture. When we collect the items for completing our Day of Service kits, each kit we complete helps someone who is struggling with their daily challenges.

We have started collecting the items below, and will purchase more items from any "Noisy Sunday" or designated donations we receive. If you would like to donate items, you may purchase them and drop them in the narthex, deliver to church office, or contact Linda Marzullo for pick up (805-688-5219, [vikingpressprint@verizon.net](mailto:vikingpressprint@verizon.net)).

The completed kits will be distributed globally by Lutheran World Relief to areas most in need. This also includes areas of the U.S. (We will be packing them on our Day of Service Event, Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>. Watch for more info.)

*Items needed are:*

### **For Personal Care Kits:**

1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping – 2 per kit)
3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging – bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

### **For School Supply Kits:**

1. 70 sheet College ruled Notebooks (spiral bound)
2. Rulers with centimeters and inches
3. Pencil sharpeners
4. Blunt tip scissors
5. #2 Pencils
6. Ballpoint (not gel) Pens, Black or Blue ink
7. 2-1/2" Erasers
8. Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)

“Make change for the better” on Noisy Sunday! Send in your donated items, check, coins or cash and make a joyful noise as we work together. Because together, we can CHANGE our world!

*From their newsletter this past month:*

Our adventure started with shopping for the ingredients we needed for our Tortas (Sandwiches). This month we had 80 tortas to make and deliver by 11 A.M. We had more than enough time to make our tortas, so there wasn't a reason to rush. When we finished, we packed everything we needed and left for our worksite...Finally, the foremen called everyone for lunch, and everyone started to approach our area. Pastor Esteban and Valerie (Malangko) began with a prayer and continued to pass out lunch and drinks. The people who were working at this site were timid, and little by little came to get their lunch and sat wherever they could to eat and hear the message that Pastor Esteban had to share with them. Many thanked us as they walked by, and one person had a question for Pastor Esteban. The man's question was a question that we are asked often, and it is "Why do you do this?" Pastor Esteban's Answer was simple: "God sent us to share his word and also share a bit of what he gives us." The expression on the man's face was priceless. He thanked Pastor Esteban and joined us in our last payer. When we finished our visit, we said our goodbyes and went back to the church with a heart full of joy and gratitude for all the blessings that God gives us without asking for anything in return. We want to share images of our beautiful time with God's people in the fields. May God Bless You all!


## **Events and Occasions**

## Church Business

### **Nyheder fra Bethania Rådet News from the Bethania Council June 17<sup>th</sup> Meeting**

To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church. Questions, if any, about these discussions, decisions, or messages should be addressed to a council member preferably in writing.

From the June Council meeting, we would like to report on the following topics:

- Confirmed the hiring of Lola Gonzalez as the new Preschool and After School Care director, beginning June 28, 2021, and confirmed the hiring of Monica Dunn as a new teacher, and Susana Rondan and Linda Morales as new preschool aides.
- Confirmed the appointment of Bill Zigler as the Long Range Plan Chair
- Authorized getting bids to replace the drapes in the Sanctuary
- Voted to construct a prayer pergola in the courtyard (where the crossbeam is now in place for lighting) at a cost of approximately \$6,000. Funding will come from designated fund for property projects. The pergola would offer an outdoor space for people to come and pray or meditate. A box will be placed in the pergola for people to leave a prayer request.
- There is no firm date for transitioning from the food distribution to the food pantry.
- Pastor will resume the 11 AM Unorthodox Service beginning June 20.
