## Pastor Chris's Message

A new day; a new creation. These are phrases that the gospels and Paul use to describe what has happened to humanity in Christ Jesus. They sound immensely positive. A fresh start. New is not the old and if the old isn't good than the new must not be bad. Something new happened when Jesus rose from the grave. The apostles encountered it, and from that, created a powerful movement.

And yet, most of those apostles were killed by Rome—same as Jesus. Paul was executed in Rome. 30 years after Jesus rose from the grave, Emperor Nero ushered in a 300 yearlong persecution of Jewish and Christian people. 40 years after Jesus rose from the grave, General (and future Emperor) Vespasian laid siege to Jerusalem, ransacking and razing the temple, killing and enslaving most Jewish and Christian people there. What was a new day, for a lot of people, felt like the same old thing.

This is a grim way to start an Easter newsletter, I know. I share this because as we enter the Easter season, a time where we celebrate spring and a God who makes all things new, we'll likely be entering another surge of cases in this pandemic, faced with responses that will, to some degree, curtail what we hoped would be a return to some consistency. It feels like the same old thing.

We live in a "fix-it" culture, one in which we expect problems we're facing to be fixed with enough effort, or enough time passed. And we've taken that "fix-it" mentality and applied it to our faith. Heaven is the ultimate fix-it. A place where all the problems and bad stuff in the world are no more. The new day and new creation we hear about in the bible, in our minds, is the ultimate newness, where all the same old stuff is gone. But we fail to recognize that for the first followers of Jesus, that wasn't the case. And yet, they were able to usher in a movement of the common person that spread so rapidly, it couldn't be stopped. So perhaps their idea of a new day, a new creation was able to hold in balance that a lot of the same old stuff would still be present, it just wouldn't have the final say—and maybe that's the true power of this new thing God does on Easter.

Easter is about a new day, but I think that new day means a day when the same old stuff doesn't have the power it once did. I think it's when we commit to a way of love and compassion even in the midst of a world that feels unrelenting. I know we're entering another Easter season within this pandemic, but my hope is that you can all focus on the love that is present and the power that each of you has in sharing that love. That love has been a shining light for a lot of people over these last 2,000 years. And if God's love can survive from that point to this point, surely God's love can carry us through this time, to something new.

Unfortunately with the rising cost of food and gas and everything else, we are also seeing a new rise in the numbers of households needing help. Numbers for the last few weeks:

February 22	160 Households	643 Individuals	15 new enrolled

Vikings donate \$5,000 to help Bethania food distribution  
Church's effort has served more than 110,000 people in 2 years

The Vikings of Solvang have donated \$5,000 to the food distribution program at Bethania Lutheran Church in Solvang, where volunteers have served more than 110,000 people since March 2020.

“This donation is in addition to the \$5,000 we contributed last year,” said Vikings Chief Max Hanberg. “Too many local people, including many children, are at risk of going to bed hungry. The Bethania program has been an important effort throughout the Covid pandemic.”

“This has been an eye-opening experience as to the extent of food insecurity here in our beautiful valley. The struggles our clients face are challenging, from the high cost of rent to low wages, seasonal work, an inadequate disability or retirement income, to homelessness,” said Linda Marzullo, a Bethania Church member who helps lead the program.

“Currently we have 1,092 households enrolled in our distribution program. Households vary in how often they choose to receive food,” she added, from “every week ... to every six weeks to two months. Clients consist of teenagers, intact families, single parent households, and disabled, elderly and the homeless. Ages served range from birth to 102.”

The Bethania effort is part of the USDA Emergency Food Distribution Program and also receives food from the Santa Barbara County Food Bank and Veggie Rescue. In addition, donations allow the purchase of supplemental food, including baby formula, as well as diapers and feminine hygiene and incontinence products.

“We are an all-volunteer distribution program ... so donations go directly into the cost of running the program,” Marzullo added. Donations can be made on the church website at [www.bethanialutheran.net](http://www.bethanialutheran.net), designating “food distribution” as the category, or by mail to Bethania Lutheran Church, 603 Atterdag Road, Solvang, 93463, earmarked for food distribution.

## Next Brown Bag Senior Breakfast Packing: April 10, 2022

Our next Brown Bag Breakfast packing day is scheduled for Palm Sunday, April 10th. We will be packing in the Parish Hall starting around 10:30. Everyone is invited to help out – all ages and abilities are needed to help pack! In March we only packed 394 bags due to lack of available supplies in stores and online (supply chain!), so we will be running out of bags to give to local seniors sometime soon.

The bags we make provide food items for local seniors to eat while taking medications. The bags are delivered by Buellton Senior Center volunteers three times a week.

If you would like to donate items, church is open daily (usually from 9-5) and you can drop off any donated items inside or at the church office, in addition to bringing items to us on packing day. You can also make a donation and earmark it "Brown Bag Breakfasts" so we can go do the shopping. Any amount of help is much appreciated!

Items we need:

- Protein Drinks (such as Ensure or Atkins)
- Soft Granola/Cereal Bars and soft Protein Bars
- Oatmeal Packets (Protein type) or small Cereal Boxes or Cups
- Fruit Cups or Applesauce
- Pudding (non-refrigerated)
- Small Juice Boxes or Plastic Bottles of Fruit Juices (such as Apple, Cranberry, Orange)

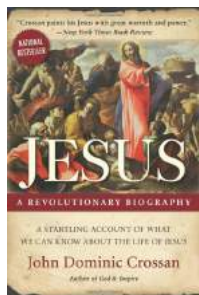
**The Last Lenten Soup Supper and Bible Study is April 6**

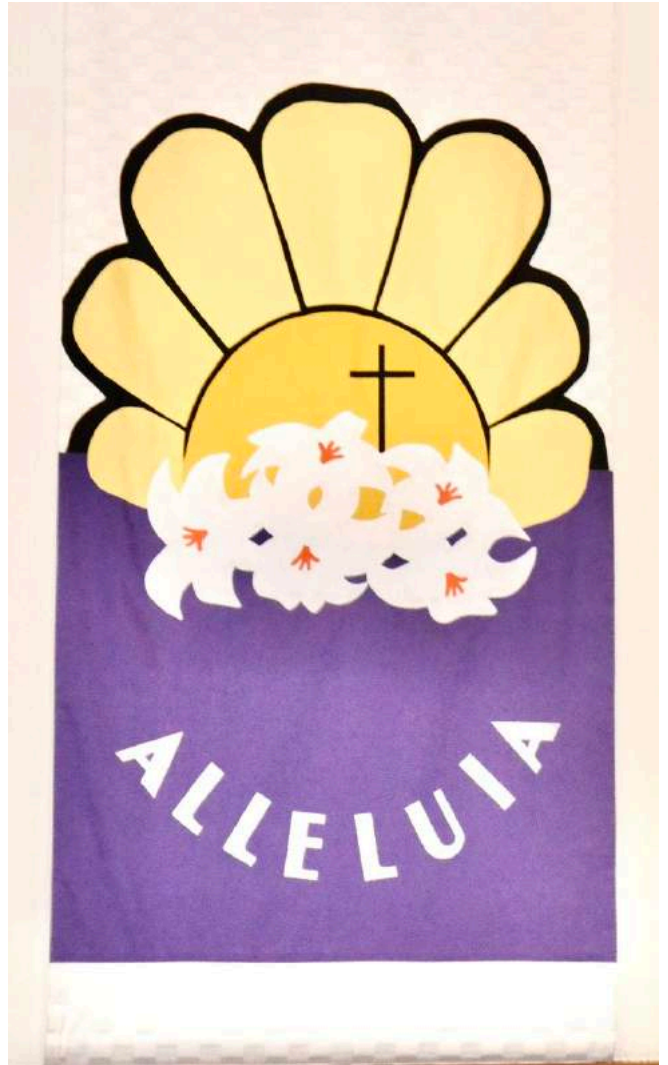
