### **Bethania's Mission Statement**

We are a community of Christ-centered, welcoming, inclusive and multi-generational people rooted in God's faith, hope and love, called to advocate for justice, give to those in need, and share God's affirming love with the world.

---

I struggle with the idea of worship. I'm not talking about our Sunday service, but the concept in general. On one hand I struggle with the idea of an all-loving, all-knowing God desiring our worship. That seems like a human trait, and not the best one. We don't hear Jesus directing worship so much as a part of this way of life we're called to. In fact, I would submit that the central tenant of the Jesus movement was justice and action for the least of these, and many churches avoid that call because of their emphasis on worship.

Jesus doesn't emphasis worship a lot, but he does emphasize praise and thanksgiving, and he almost always tells people to give praise and thanks to God before/after he's performed a miracle. In Luke, after curing 10 lepers of their disease, one returns and Jesus says, "Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Notice how Jesus doesn't direct the praise towards himself, but towards God. His actions are a reflection not of himself, but a reflection of God. In another story, in John, right before Jesus feeds the 5,000 he gives thanks and breaks the bread, and then performs this famous miracle of abundance. Praise and thanksgiving have a purpose in the Gospels. It is not something directed at God because God demands, but in recognition of the good works done through people.

I struggle with the concept of worship because in my experiences people have treated worship like it's something God demands of us, almost for the sake of worship. I've experienced services that have become banal because they are void of the purpose of coming together. However, I fully believe, and feel this myself, that worship can be an integral part of our faith life, when we have a feeling of why we're there and how it can empower us to engage in all other aspects of our Christian call. When worship is a reflection of both our Praise and Thanksgiving AND our hopes and prayers for a better world, that worship space becomes authentic and desired, rather than part of a routine. And we become part of a community because we're realize we are there giving praise and thanks for many of the same reasons and expressing the same concerns and hopes as our siblings around us.

I invite all of us this Thanksgiving to reflect on the purpose in which we come to our own worship services. Do we come because we feel like that's what we're supposed to do? Or do we come because this worship is a space to express our praise and thanksgiving for what God has done and continues to do in our lives? For those who haven't been to a Sunday service in a while, perhaps it's because we're not sure what the purpose is for us. I've also had that experience. When worship has purpose, it becomes one of the most central parts of our walk with God so that we can go out into the world and better live out this mission of love, compassion, and justice to which we are called.

I'm happy to announce that this year we are returning to visit our grandmas and grandpas up at Atterdag Village on Oct. 28th. Children and staff came dressed up in their Halloween costumes and we will trick-or-treat with our grandmas and grandpas in an outdoor setting.

I look forward to visiting the residents at Atterdag Village in the near future for Christmas and all the other events throughout the year. I also look forward to receiving our grandma's and grandpa's at Bethania with a warm welcome during the holidays as well. These events really fill my heart knowing that we can bring happiness and joy to others in the community by simply showing up and being present in the moment and just sharing our love with others.

A little news about our staff. Miss Wanda has completed her 29th year of work at Bethania Preschool! WOW! She is devoted to the teaching of young children and fostering their curiosity in a loving manner. I can remember when my daughter Sofia was in her class( she's now 7) and still to this day Sofia often asks me if she can go back to Miss Wanda's class.

In October Miss Angelica completed 20 years of work at Bethania! "I teach with love" is Miss Angelica's teaching philosophy. I see this everyday at work from her and I feel good coming into work knowing that the people who I work with share the same love and passion for what we do on a daily basis. A lot of what we do as educators goes unseen by others and we don't do things for praise or recognition rather we do things out of love and compassion for one another. We truly enjoy what we do.

We had one staff member go on maternity leave at the end of September...she had a girl... hooray! A second staff member will be going on maternity leave in November. Let us pray for a healthy delivery and many moments of family bonding and unconditional love.

The preschool took a school wide field trip to Solvang Farmer Pumpkin Patch on Oct. 18th. The children explored the life cycle of a pumpkin, walked through the corn maze and picked out their own pumpkin. Thank you Solvang Farmer Pumpkin Patch for hosting Bethania Preschool this year. The field trip went really well. It's been a few years since we've been able to do this particular field trip but I am so happy that we were able to pull it all together. I am grateful that we had a lot of Parent volunteers help drive and assist the teachers on this day. We had approximately 20 parent volunteers show up and it felt great to be together.

Thank you to our neighbor Joe who graciously helped repair the broken wood fence panels on the After School yard back in September. I wish I could show you the before and after of the fence. I remember when I was setting up after hours out in the back parking lot for either our Trunk-or-Treat or a Bike Day for the After Schoolers last year, our neighbor Joe came out and asked very politely if I needed a hand as I was trying to rope off the backlot with chairs and rope. He then brought me some caution tape and told me to keep the tape for the next time. It was the neighborly thing to do on his behalf and I want to take a moment so we can all think about how we can be a good neighbor to those around us.

I also want to take a moment to thank everyone who has helped with our fundraiser. Thank you to those that have made a personal donation or made purchases through Charleston Wrap online in order to help the Preschool and After School Programs reach our goal to get new playground equipment. Thus far we have raised \$2,032.40 towards this goal. This is amazing. I want to thank Miss Monica for coordinating this fundraiser. We couldn't have met our goals without the support of the preschool and after school families, our board members, church members, all of our friends, family and community members!

These past few weeks have been challenging regarding the numerous things I encounter on a daily basis. As many of you know the Preschool and After School has made a temporary transition to using store bought water for drinking, cooking and food handling. During the middle of this transition I was in a difficult spot. I couldn't see how I was going to get through all of this. I was trying to push myself to keep working and get my job done. At the end of my day, a parent walked in with 6 giant water jugs for the school's use. I cried in my office for a moment and then I laughed and smiled and said to myself, "This is God's goodness in my life right now." I texted this parent shortly afterward to let them know that they are a blessing...

Looking ahead, we will be closed Friday, Nov. 11th for Veterans Day and we have an early closure on Wednesday, Nov. 23rd at 3 pm and we will be closed Thursday, Nov. 24 - 25 for Thanksgiving. We will have the Big Kids here all day during this holiday week as well.

During the month of November children will focus on fall crafts/projects and we will be using a variety of art supplies and nature finds to create fall leaves, corn, cornucopias, scarecrows, trees, leaf rubbings, wreaths and of course, Turkeys. The children will learn about the changes in weather and trees.

The use of the **Blessing Box** in front of our church has been a huge eye-opener as to how many in our beautiful valley are living on the edge. Lately the box has been empty more than before. Filling it as much as we do takes a lot of items, a lot of time, and a lot of dedication. We have even been there late at night when a homeless man came and called us “angels” for helping him stay fed while he is living down in the river. Families have come by late at night, looking for cereal for their children. Older people come and take what they need for the next day. This ministry is a blessing to many.

THANK YOU to all who have contributed items, donated, and helped to keep this project going. Our goal with the Blessing Box is to have anyone in the community be able to access assistance at any time, without any stigma, from the items within it. Special thanks to Elizabeth Breen, Donna and Marcel Hinsbeeck, Carolyn Schuit, Kristyl Downey, Denise Morris, Rick Marzullo, Jan and Bill Zigler and many others who are all assisting in keeping our “mighty pantry on a post” filled for people who need it.

Whatever you use in your home – that is what we need for the Blessing Box! Items needed for the Blessing Box include canned and dried foods, snacks, cereal, coffee, condiments, cleaning supplies (such as dish soap, laundry soap, toilet bowl cleaners), cooking oil, personal care items, meal kits, tuna, chicken, mac & cheese...you get the idea. We have even been blessed with produce from local gardeners, home canned jam and cakes from Albertson's.

### **Tuesday Food Distribution: Every Tuesday, Rain or Shine!**

Bethania continues operating as an Emergency USDA Food Distribution site every Tuesday from 5:15-6:45 pm. Distribution is through drive up or walk up line each Tuesday. There are no restrictions on income or family size at this time; teenagers through people in their 90s receive food from us. We serve people from all walks of life, and in all types of circumstances. We distribute USDA food items, Food Bank items, and donations from supporters such as Veggie Rescue, El Rancho, Bob's Well Bread, and Baker's Table, among others. Bethania's program also purchases additional food items for the bags each week. All of our purchases are made with donations given to the food distribution program and through grants we have received.

The number of households we have been serving has remained high, due to the cost of gas, rent, and food. Here are the numbers from the first week of September through Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>:

Anything you use in your own home is something that can be donated and appreciated by someone else who can't afford it! We can use items in the Blessing Box or for Tuesday's Distribution. Donations can be left in the church or you can contact me to drop off items. We also distribute diapers and wipes, along with incontinence and feminine hygiene items, which are very needed. Donations are appreciated in these areas also.

If you would like to help on a Tuesday, please contact me. We appreciate and value every volunteer who assists us with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough. Our Tuesdays are split into shifts, with the unloading crew coming in at 9:30 to help move items and get ready for packing. Bag packers may come at 9:30 am or 1:30. Produce is also packed in the afternoon. Distribution helpers come around 4:45 for the evening distribution. Clean up helpers are always welcome at the end of the night.

We continue to need your prayers and support for this mission, which is making a difference in so many lives here in our area.

These bags provide food items to seniors who need to take medication with food. Many of them cannot afford this additional cost. And, of course, some of the items are used as snacks!

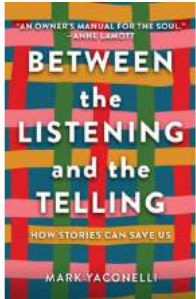

## Christmas Angels & Preschool Presents: *Calling all Angels!*

Would you like to be an “angel” to a needy child? Dust off your angel wings if you would be interested in helping to make Christmas special for a child at Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz or our Preschool this year. Any way you can help, large or small, is appreciated...We have committed to adopting 90 little Angels this year so far. With your help, we can make sure these children receive a Christmas gift to make their holiday happier.

The **CHRISTMAS ANGEL** project helps the members of Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz by providing Christmas gifts for needy children who attend the church. Iglesia is a mission start up church currently based at Bethel in Santa Maria, which serves the very poorest of the farm workers who often live in difficult circumstances. Oftentimes families share one bed or live in someone else’s garage without heat or running water. Many of the children may not have shoes, warm clothing or enough to eat. Agricultural conditions, weather and the economy directly affect these hard-working families, especially during the winter months. As we enter into the slow growing season, these families are even further behind in their ability to have enough food to eat, let alone provide Christmas gifts for their children. *(The Noisy Offering on Nov. 27 will help support the Christmas Angels/Preschool Presents gift purchases - see related article.)*

Even closer to home, the **PRESCHOOL PRESENTS** project helps to support local families who attend Bethania Preschool and After School program. These local families are chosen by Preschool Director. Your donations will assist us in purchasing gifts and other necessary items for local children, to help these families who require some assistance to make their child’s Christmas special. If you would like to shop for a Preschool child or make a donation to this project, you can earmark it “Preschool Presents”. *(This is a different donation from the Preschool Scholarship Fund.)*

We would be happy to have your Angelic assistance for any of these children. If you are interested in sponsoring a child through the Christmas Angel or the Preschool Presents Projects, donations of any amount are welcome. - The Thanksgiving Interfaith service will be held on Monday, Nov. 21 at 6 pm with Bethania hosting the service.
- The Preschool was mandated to test the water in the Parish Hall and drinking fountains. It was discovered that the lead content in the water was above the legal limit. Council voted to have reverse osmosis systems installed in all three sinks in the kitchen which will render them safe and within the legal limits for lead, and disable the drinking fountains.
- Pastor Chris shared the "Reconciling in Christ" program with the Council. This program affirms our commitment to providing safe space and welcoming to all who come to Bethania. The Council voted to move forward with this program. It will take approximately a year to go through the process. Further information will be forthcoming.
- Our organist, Cavan O'Neill has resigned to take a full-time director of music position at a church in Hanford. He will be missed and we thank him for his wonderful music.
- To date 52 responses to the Time & Talent survey have been received.
- The council approved the draft 2023 Budget to be presented to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting part 1 on Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Christian Education reported that Sunday School is going well with between 5 and 15 kids. Youth group is meeting with between 10-15 youth attending. The Unorthodox service is serving 20-30 people every Sunday and they also have a weekly pot luck dinner.
