Message from Pastor Chris

Vesper was our easy baby—the one who convinced us to have a second. Verona was the one who convinced us to stop after two. Even after Verona started sleeping through the night (meaning she didn't need to wake up and eat) she had a tough time sleeping in her room. She had terrible separation anxiety and if she would wake up in the middle of the night and we weren't there she would start to scream. I ended up researching how to help babies self-soothe and be comfortable if they wake up in the middle of the night and I found a tactic that a lot of sleep experts repeatedly encouraged and it ended up working great!

The trick was to go in her room, lay her back down, and just rub her back for about 5 minutes until she calmed down. Then sit next to the crib for another 5 minutes. Then go stand by the door for 5 minutes. Then walk out of her room. At first, the moment I stepped out she'd start to cry, so I'd go back in and just sit by her crib for a few minutes and then walk out again. This process lasted a few nights, but eventually she stopped crying when she would wake up. It was a realization for her at her young age that even though she was alone in her room, she wasn't really alone. Mommy or Daddy are just right on the other side of the door. As adults we can understand this intellectually, but for her it was a feeling of knowing that we were truly there and this feeling gave her the comfort in waking up and being able to fall back asleep on her own.

Advent is this way. A time of preparing for Christ to come into our world even though Christ has already come into our world. If Christ has already been here, why do we prepare for his coming each year during Advent? More than anything, I think it's that reminder we need that Christ is always here, even if we can't see him or feel his presence all the time. It's that reminder that even if the world around us feels scary, God is still with us. But this is an ongoing process that takes time to move from our intellectual understanding into an abiding feeling.

Advent calls us to realize several things. One, it calls us to look around and notice our environment. Christ's presence doesn't ask us to ignore the reality of the world around us, but rather to take stock of it. There's tremendous joy and love in this world and there's also concern and, at times, fear. Looking at the world realistically helps realize the second thing: that God is with us in all of this. God is with us in the community around us and God is with us in the created world reminding us that seasons are cyclical. Wherever there is winter, spring soon follows. Finally, the reminder that Christ is always with us not only gives us the courage to take stock of the world, but to navigate it in the way that Christ calls us; to go boldly through this world loving others, stewarding creation, and trying to make the world a better place because we know God is with us and God is our power.

I invite you this Advent to take some intentional time and reflect on the world around you, take stock of the world Christ comes into and notice the areas in which you need God most. What in your world needs more love, more compassion, more reminders that God is with you? How might Christ be coming into this world through you? How might God be using you to make this world a more loving and compassionate place? Advent is a process, not an instant realization. I pray that this process can be full of love and God's presence—a reminder that you are not alone and that God is pointing us to a more loving and peaceful world.

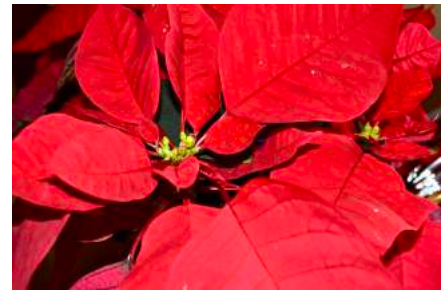


Little Christmas Eve - Dec. 23, 2022 Danish Service 6 pm

Would you like to be an “angel” to a needy child? Dust off your angel wings if you would be interested in helping to make Christmas special for a child at Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz or the Preschool this year.

Any way you can help, large or small, is appreciated...We have committed to adopting 92 little Angels from Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz and two families at the Preschool. With your help, we can make sure these children receive a Christmas gift and make their holiday happier.

The **CHRISTMAS ANGEL** project helps the members of Iglesia Luterana Santa Cruz by providing Christmas gifts for children in need who attend the church. Iglesia is a mission start up church currently based at Bethel in Santa Maria, which serves the very poorest of the farm workers who often live in difficult circumstances. Oftentimes families share one bed or live in someone else’s garage without heat or running water. Many of the children may not have shoes, warm clothing or enough to eat. Agricultural conditions, weather and the economy directly affect these hard-working families, especially during the winter months. As we enter into the slow growing season, these families are even further behind in their ability to have enough food to eat, let alone provide Christmas gifts for their children.



Even closer to home, the **PRESCHOOL PRESENTS** project helps to support local families who attend Bethania Preschool and After School program. These local families are chosen by Preschool Director. Your donations will assist us in purchasing gifts and other necessary items for local children, to help these families who require some assistance to make their child’s Christmas special. If you would like to shop for a Preschool child or make a donation to this project, you can earmark it “Preschool Presents”. *(This is a different donation from the Preschool Scholarship Fund.)*

We would be happy to have your Angelic assistance for any of these children. If you are interested in sponsoring a child through the Christmas Angel or the Preschool Presents Projects, donations of any amount are welcome. If you would prefer to do the shopping on your own, or make a contribution of an item on a child’s wish list, please let Linda Marzullo know. Next Brown Bag Senior Breakfast Packing: Dec. 4th

Our next Brown Bag Breakfast packing day is scheduled for Sunday, December 4. We will be packing in the Parish Hall starting around 10:30. Everyone is invited to help out – all ages and abilities are needed to help pack!

The brown bags we make have been flying out the door at the Buellton Senior Center, due to more seniors needing food assistance and requiring breakfast bags. The high cost of food is really hurting a lot of our neighbors who are elderly and on fixed incomes. These bags provide food items to seniors who need to take medication with food. Many of them cannot afford this additional cost.

If you are able to donate any items below, please drop it by the office or deliver on packing day. You can also make a donation and earmark it “Brown Bag Breakfasts” so we can go do the shopping. Any amount of help is much appreciated!

A special thank you to the Christian Science Society, who recently granted us additional funds for this ministry. And thanks to Kristyl Downey, who did all the grant work!

- Soft Granola/Cereal Bars and soft Protein Bars

Noisy Sunday: Celebrating the Birth of Jesus

The next “Noisy Sunday” is coming on Dec. 18th. Noisy Offering donations received that day will be used to purchase diapers, diaper rash cream, powdered formula and baby food. Consider this offering another way to recognize the birth of baby Jesus!

What will our donations be used towards?

Donations on Noisy Sunday will be used to purchase items to help struggling families keep their babies healthy, clean, fed and nurtured. For many of these families, finding funds to purchase diapers and formula are a struggle. Depending on which style of diaper, a good range to estimate for a monthly disposable diaper budget is between \$150-275 per month. The average monthly cost for powdered formula for babies is \$400 to \$800. Specialty formulas, such as those that contain hydrolyzed proteins, may cost even more.

We all really “make change for the better” with the Noisy Sunday! So bring your coins and make some noise to help celebrate the birth of Baby Jesus – and the birth of little miracles everywhere on Dec. 18th. Together, we can CHANGE a child’s world!

Entry is \$5 for children 8 and under, \$15 for everyone else.

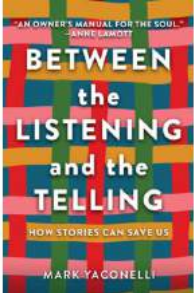

To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church.
