We are a community of Christ-centered, welcoming, inclusive and multi-generational people rooted in God's faith, hope and love, called to advocate for justice, give to those in need, and share God's affirming love with the world.

Message from Pastor Chris

At Unorthodox the last few weeks we've been going over the last week of Jesus' life and looking at both the understanding of Jesus' last week from a historical perspective (meaning what might be different than what the gospel writers tell us) and the story through the lens of the gospel writers who are writing anywhere from 40 to 70 years after Jesus' death. A recurring theme has been the realization that our theologies of Jesus death and resurrection are usually *contextless*. What do I mean by that? I mean that we typically grew up believing Jesus' death was to atone for our sins, and Jesus' resurrection was to give us "believers" everlasting life. Both of these assertions can be made without looking at the context in which these events happened, i.e. what was going on in Jerusalem and in the Greco-Roman world during this time. Not only do these theological assertions not consider context, I think they compel us to ignore context all together.

However, when we look at the context in which Jesus' death and resurrection happen, our theologies about why Jesus died and rose again open up to more understanding, and I believe, more connection to our world today. When we look at why Jesus was in Jerusalem at the time of his death, when we look at the scriptural quotes he uses during this last week, we can't ignore that Jesus was taking a stand against the collusion of Jewish Temple leaders with Roman oppression, nor can we ignore that this had something to do with why he was killed.

Likewise, when we look at the context of his resurrection, at the commandments he gave to his disciples after he rose, we see that it has less to do with where one goes after they die, and more to do with how one chooses to live knowing that Jesus is still present. When we consider that the gospel writers are all sharing this story after the Roman destruction of Jerusalem and after a concerted persecution of Jewish and Christian people, we can understand that the resurrection was not just about everlasting life, but about giving people hope and courage in the midst of horrendous circumstances. When we look back the lived experiences of people in the first and second centuries, we discover a resilience that is given birth and supported by this way of life of community, support, love, compassion, forgiveness, and caring for the least of these—all the things Jesus taught and lived out while he was alive—a way of life that was stronger than anything Rome could muster. When we look at the historical context of Jesus' death and resurrection, there's so much we simply cannot ignore because it resonates with our lived experiences today.

I can't tell you how many times I've needed to feel hope in the midst of chaotic, uncertain, sometimes horrendous circumstances. I can't tell you how many times I've felt that the powers and principalities (St. Paul's words) have felt too powerful to be overcome by love and compassion. And I can't

tell you how many times I've found that hope in knowing how it has created resilience within communities for centuries.

As your pastor it is that hope that I want to resonate with you when you think of Jesus' resurrection, the empty tomb, Easter Sunday. Whenever you are feeling that overwhelming sense of an uncertain world, I want you to remember our Lord who could not be contained by the power of his uncertain world, and I want you to remember that hope that has resonated with communities in real, lived-out ways for 2,000 years. I want you to remember that it wasn't just a promise of everlasting life, but more powerfully, the promise of our God to be present with us in our darkest moments, reminding us that darkness and death do not have the final say in our lives. We believe in a God of new life, a God of renewed hope, and a God who has been working through our ancestors beyond measure time and time again. Wherever you are at in this stage of your life, I pray that you can find hope in the promises of God, in this community that continues to abide with you, and in your pastor who loves you and is here for you. Easter blessings to you all. He is Risen Indeed!

Noisy Sunday: Making Change Count April 23

For our Noisy Offering April 23, we will be using our coins and cash to help fight hunger locally.

Why do we need to support this?

- According to the U.S. Census' Household Pulse Survey for California (https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/household-pulse-survey/data.html) for the past 3 months, 14.4% of all household respondents experience, sometimes or often, not having enough to eat. That means more than one in seven families are hungry.
- This computes to nearly 900 families in the Santa Ynez Valley who experience hunger each week!
- Since inception on March 24, 2020, our own Food Distribution has delivered over **1**½ **million pounds of food** to needy families/households in our area.

- The Blessing Box has helped hundreds of people "get by" by being stocked daily with food items.
- Donations will help keep local people, right here in the Santa Ynez Valley.

We all "make change for the better" when we participate even in small ways. Thank you for helping fight hunger that our neighbors are facing.



Theo Pub



Nyheder fra Bethania Rådet News from the Bethania Council - March 16, 2023

To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church.

From the March Council meeting, we would like to report on the following topics:

- Pastor reported that the food distribution was awarded a grant from the Synod in the amount of \$5,000
- The Executive Committee (Ron Walsh Leigh Berenger, Carol lake & Jan Zigler) conducted Pastor Chris's review for 2022. The review was conducted in accordance with the Synod guidelines. Pastor has done a wonderful job this last year and all were in agreement that he fulfilled the goals that were set jointly by him and the Church Council in 2022.
- Bill Zigler reported that the material for a steel fence between the Parish Hall and the parsonage was on site, and would soon be installed (barring weather considerations).
- Pastor gave a report on Push Pay (our on-line giving platform). It has been very effective and on an average is being used by approximately 120 donors regularly.
- There will be two services on Easter Sunday one at 9 am and the other at 11 am.
- The next Council meeting date will be Thursday, April 20th at 7 pm in the Fireside Room
