# **Message from Pastor Chris**

I've been doing some reflecting lately—searching for a feeling, really. I think the impetus for this has to do with what experts are calling the "loss of institutional memory" due to the pandemic. The effects of the pandemic were so pervasive that at an institutional level we've forgotten how things were or how we used to do them before the pandemic. This phenomenon is being reported across the spectrum of institutions throughout the US. At Bethania, while I've often explored with members and council what we remember of how we used to do things, what I've been reflecting on lately is far more what it FELT LIKE when we did what we did before the pandemic. And I have to say folks, the feeling I keep coming back to is JOY.

I remember such joy prior to the pandemic. Now please understand, I'm not saying that feeling isn't here now, it's just accompanied more with the anxieties that developed over the last 3 years. I think we all have those feelings of anxiety now, which isn't bad, but I'm feeling called back to that pervasive feeling of joy and I would like to invite you all to help cultivate that as a community again.

As I think about the cause of a lot of the anxiety, at least for myself over the last 3 years, two causes come to mind. The first was the survival of Bethania. Churches were hit particularly hard by the pandemic and there was a deep fear of what might happen to here. We're beyond the pandemic now and we're going to be okay, so there's definitely relief. However, the second cause has been this perpetual outrage and anger towards others that came out of the pandemic—and I'm just as guilty as anyone of being overcome by this at times. But I'm tired of it, and I imagine you are too.

The blessing—and this is really what I've been reflecting on—is that when it comes down to it, I think Bethania can transcend these feelings and be something more. We've always been a church that has people from diverse spectrums and that continues to be such a gift. We don't need to get bogged down by ideological differences because we have more that we can come together in and celebrate and enJOY. My hope is that we can move forward into these spaces and find that pervasive joy that even transcends the obstacles of life and the pull of society to divide and outrage.

For us at Bethania, those feelings of joy have been centered in how we experience community with one another and how we share compassion with those around us. One of the blessings and curses that came from the pandemic was it sent us into more digital meetings of interacting with each other. It was a blessing because it saved lives when it was most necessary, and it's a curse because now when we can gather once again, we've become more dependent on digital mediums and being isolated.

However, to experience the joy and community that Bethania is so centered in, it does take some intentionality to show up, to fight the urge of relying on digital mediums, and be with one another in person. It takes intentionality to have human connection and conversation again after a time when that was stripped from us for so long. Not only do I think we can step into this way of life again, I think people are genuinely craving it! I especially want to emphasize the community aspect that is so central to our identity.

As we move forward through the summer and into our regular schedule in the fall, our plan is to have more space to just gather. Not so much with a mission other than to be in community and experience that joy I believe so many people are missing! Currently, our Bethania Lutheran Church Women's group is scheduling regular gatherings and these have been hysterically fun and well attended. Additionally we'll be having our End of Summer BBQ in August, a New Members Party in the near future, and other regular gatherings centered in just being together. And of course, while we'll always offer our worship service on YouTube, there's something special about coming and being there with your community and grabbing some coffee, treats, and conversation afterwards that's so meaningful.

As you hear about these, I want you to feel personally invited to show up. If you haven't been to church in a while, if you've been participating digitally, and if you have the ability to come, please do! I know it's become easy to stay home, but there is such a sacredness in being together, and it's going to take some intentionality to break out of the routines created by the pandemic. As I think about the future of The Church, I fundamentally believe the churches that can cultivate these community driven spaces are going to be the churches of the future. The blessing is this is who we were before the pandemic and it's really who we are now. So please feel invited to come and be part of these spaces and part of this pervasive joy at Bethania!

# **Food Distribution and Blessing Box**

With the Food Distribution closed for two weeks due to VBS and the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday, our volunteers are getting a much-needed break. Numbers for food assistance have remained high (over 200 households per week) and the paperwork is just as high. We have been purchasing items three weeks out of the month, since Food Bank is now only giving us items from the USDA one week a month – so, we are spending more money and feeding more people with less help. Contributions are always appreciated!

Some of the stories we hear can break your heart. Recently there have been prayer requests for many who have health issues and surgeries. It is special that these people ask us to pray for them and share their pain. A young woman with three children, one about 6 and the others aged 1 and 2, told us her husband left her. She has no job skills, no income and is living on people's couches with her children. She needed some clothes for her kids (which we found for her), baby items, toilet paper and toothbrushes. Another woman had a similar story but had no place to live or stay. Her husband decided to return to Mexico and left. She is an agricultural worker, with three children, living in her car. Several of our volunteers were trying to find her a shelter she felt safe in. She was hoping we knew of one in Solvang, where she "feels safer than in Santa Maria" with the children. Unfortunately, that does not exist here.

The Blessing Box always needs items – but right now, consider donating items that do not have to be cooked on a stove or can be heated easily in a microwave. Quite a few people are able to stay in a motel for a night or two occasionally, including a teenager last week who had to leave his home and was excited that we had cereal and boxed milk to offer him among with other items in the Blessing Box. Or, donate some items for our pantry so we have things available when the need comes up. Someone out there can use a "blessing" from Bethania – and we never know when they will arrive for help.

Bethania continues operating as a Food Distribution site every Tuesday from 5:15-6:45 pm. We will be back working on July 11<sup>th</sup>. If you would like to help on a Tuesday, please contact me. We appreciate and value every volunteer who assists us with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough. Our Tuesdays are split into three shifts, with the morning crew coming in at 9:00 to pack bags, unloaders and produce packers around 1:15 – and USDA packers on the last week of the month. Distribution helpers come around 4:45 for the evening distribution. Clean up helpers are always welcome at the end of the night.

We continue to need your prayers and support for this mission, which is making a difference in so many lives here in our area.

The next "Noisy Sunday" is coming on July 23rd. Our "joyful noise" will be helping to send a child to school. In many countries, the family must provide all the items needed to attend school: paper, ruler, pencils, pens, etc.

It is incredible to think about how we can change someone's life by providing pens, pencils and paper. Or how we can help someone keep healthy by providing a bar of soap and a towel. These are small things that add up to a much larger picture. When we collect the items for completing our Day of Service kits, each kit we complete helps someone who is struggling with their daily challenges.

We have started collecting the items below, and will purchase more items from any "Noisy Sunday" or designated donations we receive. If you would like to donate items, you may purchase them and drop them in the narthex, deliver to church office, or contact Linda Marzullo for pick up (805-688-5219, vikingpressprint@verizon.net).

The completed kits will be distributed globally by Lutheran World Relief to areas most in need. This also includes areas of the U.S. (We will be packing them on our Day of Service Event, Sept. 10th. Watch for more info.)

Items needed are:

#### For Personal Care Kits:

- 1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
- 2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping 2 per kit)
- 3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
- 4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
- 5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)


#### For School Supply Kits:

# Nyheder fra Bethania Rådet News from the Bethania Council - June 22, 2023

To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church. Questions, if any, about these discussions, decisions, or messages should be addressed to a council member preferably in writing.

From the June Council meeting, we would like to report on the following topics:

- There was input from a congregation member who asked about the possibility of a new pictorial directory. Council will consider this at an upcoming meeting.
- Food distribution continues to serve over 200 families and 1,000 family members each week. There will be no food distribution on the June 27<sup>th</sup> due to VBS, and no distribution on July 4<sup>th</sup>. The Solvang City Council awarded a \$10,000 grant to our food distribution, as well as receiving \$16,000 from the Hike Against Hunger and \$3,000 from the Stuff Sale.
- There is a church-wide clean-up day scheduled for Sept. 10 to address a number of projects such as cleaning windows, painting etc. It will be held immediately after the Day of Service packing of school kits and personal hygiene kits.
- Council approved the hiring of Hayley Renteria as part-time preschool aide.
- The council approved a motion from the Property Committee to form a long-range property committee to review usage of all of our spaces on the campus.

The next council meeting will be held on July 20th at 7 PM in the Fireside Room.
