Message from Pastor Chris

Recently, a high school friend of mine reached out to me because they were church shopping in their area in Texas and wanted some input. They had been seeing a lot of the stuff I share on social media about our faith operating through the lens of compassion, inclusion, love, grace, and justice, especially for the least of these and she wanted to find a church and pastor with a similar theology, but she simply didn't know how to navigate the search. As a younger person, she was inclined to find a church with a more contemporary worship style, but she didn't know what their theology was like. In the instances where she checked out some of those churches, she quickly discovered they refused to allow women to be in any kind of leadership role. She thought about looking for a Lutheran church in her area. Like many people, she thought you had to be a die-hard Lutheran, and she didn't know what that meant. So she asked me, "How do I know the difference between all these denominations, non-denominations, etc.?"

I gave her a very lengthy answer, but it got me thinking about this question in regard to the Church in general. One thing I said to her, and it's the purpose of my newsletter today, is that denominationalism is practically meaningless today. You don't need to know a lot about the origins of the Lutheran, Presbyterian, Episcopalian, Methodist, or any mainline protestant church to go and check one out. But what I really emphasized with my response was that churches today are far more distinguished by their *VALUES* than their denominational beliefs. Ignore what the denomination of a church is, and rather, go on their website and see what values are espoused in their statements. For example, our mission statement is right on the homepage of our website, and it reads, "We are a community of Christ-centered, welcoming, inclusive and multi-generational people rooted in God's faith, hope and love, called to advocate for justice, give to those in need, and share God's affirming love with the world." The value that's really present in that statement is "Christ-Centered" but centered primarily in the way of life that Jesus calls us to, through service, love, inclusiveness, and compassion.


Ultimately, this was a novel way for her to think about "church-shopping", and I think it's a wonderful way for us to think of own identity. I share a lot in my sermons how we are a church that focuses more on Christianity as a way of life over a belief system, and at the center of that I think are our values; values that have been important to this congregation since its inception over 100 years ago. I would love to invite you to think of both our church and your faith life through the lens of values, perhaps over beliefs. What are the values that are important to you? How are those values reflected

in your relationship with our church community and in your daily faith life? How would like to see those values reflected more, if necessary?

I think it's fair to say, when we look at Jesus' ministry in the gospels, he doesn't spend a lot of time creating new systems of belief, but he spends a great deal of time both challenging the values of the world around him and trying to highlight the values of the kingdom of heaven. I wish the church would have keyed in on these lessons, or at least held on to them longer. But as I reflect on Bethania, both its place in our community now, and its presence in our community in the past, I think it's fair to say it has always been a church centered in values, and those values have carried it forward through many challenges and triumphs. I look at our church with such pride because of the values we're beholden to and the values we espouse in our gathering and in our ministry. I hope you can not only look at our story with similar pride, but also in how our story has shaped your personal values throughout your life here.

Personal Care & School Supply Kit Items Needed!

We will be collecting items this summer for the "DAY OF SERVICE" assembly of Personal Care Kits and School Supplies for Lutheran World Relief.

You can help people dealing with some of life's most difficult situations —the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing home to escape violence, and living in extreme poverty. When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything. Natural disasters such as earthquakes and refugee camps are typical distribution areas for these kits. Around the world people suffer each day because of lack of basic hygiene. In refugee camps and in the world's poorest communities, a few simple items can mean the difference between sickness and health, and life and death.

Why school supplies? Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Here are the items we are collecting. Watch for sales this summer!

Items needed are:

For Personal Care Kits:

- 1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
- 2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping 2 per kit)
- 3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
- 4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
- 5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

For School Supply Kits:

- 1. <u>70 sheet</u> College ruled Notebooks (spiral bound)
- 2. Rulers with centimeters and inches
- 3. Pencil sharpeners
- 4. Blunt tip scissors
- 5. #2 Pencils
- 6. 2-1/2" Erasers
- 7. Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)



Nyheder fra Bethania Rådet News from the Bethania Council - May 18, 2023

To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church. Questions, if any, about these discussions, decisions, or messages should be addressed to a council member preferably in writing.

From the May Council meeting, we would like to report on the following topics:

- The concrete work at the entrance to the church is completed, but needs to cure for a couple
 of weeks before it can be used.
- We are considering options for a new directory possibly digital, or printed copy without photos. More information to come.
- The Reconciling in Christ task force has been meeting, and educational opportunities to learn more about their work will be held during the summer.
- Pastor Chris reported that we have had 6 new members join the church in the last two months, all from the Unorthodox service.
- Council approved the hiring of Megan Morgan as a part-time aide for the Preschool.
- Pastor Chris reported that we have had a neighboring resident who has been harassing the food distribution volunteers. It escalated on May 2nd, when he walked into the church seeking a confrontation with one of our volunteers – the police were called and he was separated from our volunteers. In order to protect our volunteers, a temporary restraining order has been filed.

Please note that the date of the next Council meeting has been changed to **June 22nd at 7 pm** in the Fireside Room.
