Message from Pastor Chris

I just listened to a fascinating episode on NPR's Hidden Brain podcast about pleasure and pain, called "The Paradox of Pleasure". Psychiatrist Anne Lembke talks in the episode about a recent discovery scientists have made about the brain. We've known for a while that the pain and pleasure points are located in the same part of the brain, but scientists have recently discovered that these points of pain and pleasure compete with each other in an ongoing process of seeking homeostasis.

This might seem either meaningless or irrelevant, but she describes the evolutionary reason this exists within our brain. Imagine 2,000 years ago you're wandering around and you're hungry and you come across a date tree. After eating the dates and satisfying your hunger, the pleasure part of the brain is activated and releases dopamine, creating a pleasurable and meaningful memory. But now the dates are gone and that was the only tree. So begins the walk to find more sustenance. However, that pleasurable memory of the date has become a primary motivational factor to find more food. And the subsequent pain of becoming hungry again, of having to walk several miles looking for more food become a needed balance to the pleasure of the date tree and an additional motivational factor. This relationship between pain and pleasure in the brain has been one of the main driving forces for human ingenuity and survival for hundreds of thousands of years.

Now fast forward 2,000 years to today. We have become a society that has pleasure at its fingertips 24/7, thanks to technology. Social media and smart phones offer immediate escapes, algorithms use our own patterns to discover what we love and put it in front of us constantly, every passion or hobby imaginable has been quantified and packaged for individual consumption, regular TV has been replaced by streaming services and binge-watched television shows, news has become a 24/7 cycle, not just on TV, but online and on our phones as well. The necessary process of waiting and having to work for pleasure has been stripped away because pleasure is around us all the time, and scientists are realizing that the brain's function of balancing pleasure with pain is creating a massive dopamine-deficiency in people across the globe, young and old alike, leading to increases in anxiety, depression, irritability, and suicide.

As a pastor this fascinates me for two reasons. One, this is a ubiquitous problem, not relegated to the outliers. We're all suffering from this and it's a leading cause of the deep division, anger, and polarization we're experiencing as a society. The second reason is churches largely contribute to this problem. Knowingly or unknowingly (I think unknowingly), with a move toward offering people immediate pleasure and good feelings the moment they walk in the door, with updated worship spaces, expensive sound systems, and personalized messages of exclusive salvation, churches are

trying to flood the pleasure points of people's brains. This has become the de facto way of doing church in today's world.

My point in sharing all this is not to depress anyone because of this ubiquitous problem, but rather, to point to a solution. Scientists believe we can move past this new way of life by trying to insulate ourselves from 24/7 exposure to pleasure and move back to a slower way of life, one that incorporates *intentionality*. Bethania is not a space that offers the flashy worship services that immediately active the pleasure points of the brain, but we are a space that activates more sustaining aspects of pleasure that people depend on: community and compassion. Each of these takes intentionality. You don't get it right when you walk in the door. You have to show up and participate, engage and connect. You can't do it from a TV screen and you can't do it from being home alone. And it's becoming increasingly difficult to do it out in the world because the world is wrapped up in being exposed to 24/7 pleasure (think of the couple at a restaurant who spend the entire time staring at their phones). Because this intentionality takes time, it allows the brain to cool off and actually feel pleasure. It creates lasting memories and has the potential to remind us of what we once had and what we truly miss: community and compassion.

This is my hope for Bethania during this next program year. I'd like us to return to the ways of community and compassion that we were so fond of prior to the pandemic and that used to be our normal ways of pleasure before smartphones and 24/7 news cycles. But again, it'll take intentionality and effort. I believe our world is craving this kind of connection again, but doesn't know how to find it, and churches that have been engaged in this way of life offer something that has become unique. So, if you're reading this article, consider showing up and participating in the community driven events we'll be having at Bethania, our worship services and coffee hour, the End-of-Summer BBQ, our Day of Service, the quilting group, the book group, the prayer group, etc. With a little intentionality you may rediscover how joyful this space truly is and we can become a beacon of hope that I think the world is soon going to be looking for.

This year we are boosting our efforts to make a difference in our community and our world by assembling Personal Care Kits, School Kits, and school supplies for local children. Our "Day of Service" projects will make a difference in lives here in the Santa Ynez Valley and around the world. Please consider donating items in addition to giving us some of your change. Together, we can "change" our world, one coin at a time.

Day of Service Items Needed!

Our "Day of Service" will be held on Sept. 10, an ELCA-wide vent focusing on the needs of our communities and our world. We will be collecting items this summer for assembly of Lutheran World Relief Personal Care Kits, School Supplies, and school supplies for local children.

Personal Care Kits help people dealing with some of life's most difficult situations –the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing home to escape violence, and living in extreme poverty. When LWR distributes Personal Care Kits, it's often to people who have lost everything to natural or man-made disasters.

School Kits are given to children to help them have the supplies to be able to attend school. Imagine having to choose between eating a meal or purchasing a notebook. In the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Here are the items we are collecting. Watch for sales and help us stock up!

Items needed are:

For Personal Care Kits:

- 1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
- 2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping 2 per kit)
- 3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
- 4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
- 5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

For School Supply Kits:

- 1. <u>70 sheet</u> College ruled Notebooks (spiral bound)
- 2. Rulers with centimeters and inches
- 3. Pencil sharpeners
- 4. Blunt tip scissors
- 5. #2 Pencils NOT SHARPENED please!
- 6. Ballpoint (not gel) Pens, Black or Blue ink
- 7. 2-1/2" Erasers
- 8. Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)



To be more informative and transparent, your Church Council is continuing the new process of communicating news and publishing decisions we have made via the Beacon. Our goal, each month, is to announce major decisions taken by the council to help everyone stay abreast of issues facing the church.

From the July Council meeting, we would like to report on the following topics:

- Social Ministry and the food distribution are sponsoring a Community Forum on July 29th.
 There will be a dinner followed by presentations by community groups and possible employers to inform attendees about food insecurity, job opportunities. It is open to all.
- An agreement was reached with the neighbor who was harassing our volunteers during food distribution. It was agreed upon by the council and the neighbor and his attorney.
- The council approved the new contract for our bookkeeper for the coming year. We also approved using on-line banking and on-line bill paying by the bookkeeper. All transactions will be approved by authorized signers for the church's bank accounts.
- Approved the purchase of a new microwave for the parsonage and the installation of a water line for the ice maker in the refrigerator.

The next council meeting will be held on Aug. 17th at 7 PM in the Fireside Room.
