Pastor Chris's Message

Nothing says I love you like, "And to dust you shall return." Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year and while many couples will be gathered together over nice dinners celebrating their love of one another, I'll be smearing palm tree ash on people's foreheads, reminding them they're going to return to the dust from whence they came. Love surely is in the air.

While it may seem far-fetched, I think the celebration of Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday can play off one another. I think of it this way. 13.8 billion years have lead you to this moment right here where you're reading these words. The chemical needs to create life on earth are so vast and have to be so perfect that for the creation of life to happen, you existing in this moment is an absolute miracle. And yet, your existence wouldn't even register as a blip if we were to put the expansion of the universe on a timeline. And yet, here you are, reading these words. Everything you've ever gone through, experienced, will experience, every moment of meaning, every memory that has created the person you are have all happened on that blip. Sometimes the joy I experience inside feels so magnanimous I imagine it could fill this expansive universe, and yet that feeling is juxtaposed with that blip.

Ash Wednesday reminds us that from dust we were created and to dust we shall one day return. This blip is what we have. And while intellectually we could say it's just a blip, a tiny particle in the evergrowing universe, our personal experience within it can feel magnanimous, right? Jesus showed up in a blip and in that short time he changed the world. He pointed to people and showed them that in this time we've been given, we are loved, just as we are, and if we can love others too, this blip of ours will feel immense.

How do we spend this blip we have? I believe that's the real question that is posed every Ash Wednesday, at least for me. From dust you came and to dust you will return. How will you spend the time in between? The world is competing for our time and energy during that blip. And at times we give into the world, and at times we give in to the divine. It's been my experience that when I choose to just love people, that's when this blip becomes so magnanimous that it can't possibly be just a blip.

Lenten Soup Suppers Story Telling: Grace

We'll be gathering again for our weekly Lenten soup suppers, and as we did last year, we'll be sharing stories from our lives. The theme for our story telling this year will be Grace. We tend to think of Grace in Lutheran terms of moments when we should have negative consequences, but someone extends grace and love instead. But Grace can also be any moment of someone extending a kindness when least expected. It's the opposite of quid pro quo, it intersects this idea that relationships should be transactional, and Grace is any action of kindness or love given without motive or need of a response.

And I'm looking for Story Tellers! If you have a story from your life where someone extended Grace to you, or where life extended Grace to you and it was an impactful moment, please consider sharing your story. I'm looking for anywhere from 5-10 Story Tellers, and each story should only be about 5 minutes or so long.

Communion Bread

Faith in Action

Food Distribution at Bethania – Making A Difference Locally

Bethania continues operating as a Food Distribution site every Tuesday. This past month we have been converting to an electronic check-in system from the Food Bank.

On Jan. 23, we helped some elderly people with specific health needs, a young man who requires a special protein drink for this kidney failure, a woman whose partner died and she has lost a significant portion of her income as well as her support, young mothers with babies who need formula. All sorts of people need a little help, the majority of whom are working.

You can donate protein items, cereal, soup, macaroni and cheese, canned meat, chili, pasta and jam for the Blessing Box or for Tuesday's Distribution. Please contact Linda Marzullo or Kristyl in the Church office if you need more info. Donations of diapers and wipes, along with incontinence and feminine hygiene items, protein drinks and baby food, are also needed.

If you would like to volunteer, please contact me. Our Tuesdays are split into shifts: 9 am - help move items and get ready for packing; 1:30 pm unload the Food Bank truck; produce is packed; 4:45 prepare for the evening distribution; 6:45 pm clean-up.

We continue to need your prayers and support which is making a difference in so many lives in our area. We appreciate everyone who assists with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough

Brown Bag Breakfast items we need:

- Protein Drinks (such as Ensure or Atkins)
- Soft Granola/Cereal Bars and soft Protein Bars
- Oatmeal Packets (Protein type) or small Cereal Boxes or Cups
- Fruit Cups or Applesauce

- Pudding (non-refrigerated)
- Small Juice Boxes or Plastic Bottles of Fruit Juices (such as Apple, Cranberry, Orange)

If you are able to donate these food items, please drop them by the office or deliver on packing day. You can also make a donation and earmark it "Brown Bag Breakfasts" and we can shop for you.






