#### **Pastor Chris's Message**

Something weird has been happening to me... something I swore would never, ever, happen. I've started enjoying country music. You don't understand, I grew up in the Southern California 90s, where grunge music, mostly popularized by Nirvana, was firmly implanted in the psyche of my generation, where west coast hip hop reigned supreme, and a little Long Beach band called Sublime brought Ska into the mainstream. Not only was country music not in the wheelhouse of the SoCal vibe, I grew up believing it was antithetical to the endless summer, SoCal way of life.

Livier and I started watching the ever-popular TV show, Yellowstone, starring Kevin Costner, about a Montana ranch owner using Godfather methods to keep his family's ranch out of the hands of "outsiders". Cowboys haven't been this famous on TV since Dallas left the soap opera airwaves in '91. Yellowstone is a good show, highlighting some of the most beautiful landscapes in the United States, and in the background is an ongoing playlist of today's country music. While the drama onscreen occupied much of my attention, the music seeped into my subconscious until I remember thinking I don't hate this. Then I found the Yellowstone playlist on Spotify and decided to play it while I was driving to SLO, and figured I'd turn it off and get it out of my system once the drive was over, but I've been listening to it for a couple weeks now. I even found an artist I've become enamored with, Ryan Bingham. He's got a rusty voice and a raw sense of lyrical themes. Livier thinks I have a mancrush (I totally do).

The other day I sat back and genuinely wondered why I'm suddenly enjoying this new genre of music so much, a genre I've historically distasted. I found it was also paralleling a place I'm at in life where the lengthening days feel like time is slowing down just ever so slightly; enough to appreciate the warmer spring weather and the way the clouds dance over the mountains and back again.

I always felt my place was in the bustle of the greater Los Angeles area in which I was raised, with easy access to my favorite beaches, secret mom-and-pop eateries, concert venues, and of course the great cathedral known as Dodgers Stadium. But living in Solvang for 9 years now, the slowness of life is catching up with me in a meaningful way. I find myself craving presence in creation, the intentionality of conversation with church members, and the desperation that time slow down enough for me to appreciate my children where they are in this stage of life before they move onto the next. I feel removed from the exciting chaos of urban and suburban life and more entrenched in the connected slowness of this community of ours.

And that's why I've been enjoying country music so much lately. As I listen to various song lyrics, they aren't just about BBQ stains on white T-shirts, but about a slowness of life that exists perpetually in a different part of the country from which I was raised. Perhaps I'm a sentimental fool, but I feel like we lost time over the last few years, and I'm inclined to grasp as much as I can now, both as an ordinary guy, and as your pastor. I've been intentional on this Season of Joy and in gathering as a community because those moments pull us away from past and future and plop us squarely into now, where we can laugh, cry, love, support, and care for each other, where we can appreciate rare Spring rain, and the experienced novelty of radiant wildflowers as old as time. It's crazy to me, that anyone could possibly fathom a future otherworld having a monopoly on Heaven, when there's so much beauty and love around us right now. We feel it in the shifting experiences of life, the diversity of notes and chords striking us in different stages of growing older, and in the piercing joy of a friend or stranger's smile. And if we can transcend our anxieties about elsewhere and give ourselves the gift of right now with each other and with creation around us, we can experience it. I just wish it would go a little slower.


