# Translating the Word – by Peter Rollins

It has been said that many years ago there lived a young and gifted woman called Sophia who received a vision in which God spoke to her as a dear friend. In this conversation God asked that Sophia dedicate her life to the task of translating and distributing the Word of God throughout her country. Now, at this time the printing press had only recently been invented, and the only Bibles to be found were written in Latin and kept under lock and key within churches. Sophia was from a poor farming village on the outskirts of the city, so the task seemed impossible. She would have to raise a vast sum of money to purchase the necessary printing equipment, rent a building to house it, and hire scholars with the ability to translate the Latin verses into the country's common tongue. However, the impossibility of the task did not sway her in the least. After having received her vision, Sophia sold the few items she possessed and left the village to live on the streets of the city, begging for the money that was required and dedicating herself to any work that was available in order to help

Raising the money proved to be a long and difficult task, for while there were a few who gave generously, most only gave little, if anything at all. In addition to this, living on the streets involved great personal suffering. But gradually, over the next fifteen years, the money began to accumulate.

Shortly before the plans for the printing press could be set in motion, a dreadful flood devastated a nearby town, destroying many people's homes and livelihood. When the news reached Sophia she gathered up what she had raised and spent it on food for the hungry, material to help rebuild lost homes, and basic provisions for the dispossessed.

Eventually the town began to recover from the natural disaster that had befallen it and so Sophia left and returned to the city in order to start over again, all the while remembering the vision that God had planted deep in her heart.

Many more years passed slowly, extracting their heavy toll on the beautiful Sophia. But there were now many who had been touched by her love and dedication, so although people were poor, the money began to accumulate once again. However, after nine more years, disaster struck again. This time a plague descended upon the city, stealing the lives of thousands and leaving many children without family or support.

By now Sophia was tired and very ill, yet without hesitation she used the money that had been collected to buy medicines for the sick, homes for the orphaned, and land where the dead could be buried safely.

Never once did she forget the vision that God had imparted to her, but the severity of the plague required that she set this sacred call to one side in order to help with the emergency. Only when the shadow of the plague had lifted did she once again take to the streets, driven by her desire to translate the Word of God and distribute it among the people.

Finally, shortly before her death, Sophia was able to gather together the money required for the printing press, the building, and the translators. Although she was, by this time, close to death, Sophia lived long enough to see the first Bibles printed and distributed.

It is said to this day that Sophia had actually accomplished her task of translating and distributing the Word of God three times during her life rather than simply once—the first two being more beautiful and radiant than the last.


Speaking of help...If you would like to help on a Tuesday, please contact me. We appreciate and value every volunteer who assists us with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough. Our Tuesdays

are split into shifts, with the packing crew coming in at 9:00 to pack bags

for distribution. We also have the "moving crew" to help move items and get ready for the day. The truck(s) come around 1:15, when we unload and pack produce. Our most critical need right now is extra help in the evening for distribution – this is work that involves lifting boxes and bags and packing people's cars and carts. Clean up helpers are always welcome at the end of the night.

Donna Hinsbeeck was just honored as our "Champion of the Valley" for all her work around Bethania and with the Food Distribution! It is so nice to receive recognition for all of this work we have been doing for four years. Additionally, with a recent grant from the SB Foundation and from the Kei Lin Foundation, we have been blessed with funds to help us purchase food for the 250+ households who are coming each week.

Bethania continues operating as a SB Co. FoodBank distribution site every Tuesday from 5:15-6:45 pm. Distribution is through



k distribution is through drive up or walk up line each Tuesday. We serve people from all walks of life, and in all types of circumstances. Once a month we receive a USDA shipment, for which there is no charge. The rest of the weeks, Bethania purchases items and receives free produce from the FoodBank and other donors.


# **Theo Pub**

# **Book Group**

The Bethania Book Group will be starting a new book called **The** End of Drum-Time by Hanna Pylväinen. A finalist for the 2023 National Book Award, it is about a remote village in 1851 in the Scandinavian tundra, in which a Lutheran minister known as Mad Lasse tries in vain to convert the native Sámi reindeer herders to his faith. But when one of the most respected herders has a dramatic awakening and dedicates his life to the church, his impetuous son, Ivvár, is left to guard their diminishing herd alone. By chance, he meets Mad Lasse's daughter Willa, and their blossoming infatuation grows into something that ultimately crosses borders—of cultures, of beliefs, and of political divides—as Willa follows the herders on their arduous annual migration north to the sea. Gorgeously written and sweeping in scope, Hanna Pvlväinen's The End of Drum-Time immerses readers in a world lit by the northern lights, steeped in age-old rituals, and guided by passions that transcend place and time.

# **Christmas Angels & Preschool Presents**

Would you like to be an "angel" to a child in need? You can make Christmas special for a child at Iglesia Luterana San Juan Baptista or our Preschool this year. Any way you can help is appreciated... We have committed to adopting 50 little Angels this year so far plus some children from our own Preschool/After School program. Your help makes their holiday happier.

The **CHRISTMAS ANGEL** project helps members of Iglesia Luterana San Juan Baptista by providing Christmas gifts for needy children who attend the church. Iglesia is a mission partner of Bethel in Santa Maria, which serves the very poorest of the farm workers who often live in difficult circumstances. Oftentimes families share one bed or live in someone else's garage without heat or running water. Many of the children may not have shoes, warm clothing or enough to eat. Agricultural conditions, weather and the economy directly affect these hard-working families, especially during the winter months. As we enter into the slow growing season, these families are even further behind in their ability to have enough food to eat, let alone provide Christmas gifts for their children. (*The Noisy Offering on Nov. 24 will help support the Christmas Angels/Preschool Presents gift purchases - see related article.*)

Even closer to home, the **PRESCHOOL PRESENTS** project supports local families who attend Bethania Preschool and After School program. These families are chosen by the Preschool Director. The children remain anonymous. Your donations will assist us in purchasing gifts and other necessary items for these children, whose families who require some assistance to make their child's Christmas special. If you would like to shop for a Preschool child or make a donation to this project, you can earmark it "Preschool Presents" (funds donated go towards this project, not to the Preschool itself).

We are happy to have your Angelic assistance for any of these children. If you are interested in sponsoring a child through the Christmas Angel or the Preschool Presents Projects, donations of any amount are welcome. If you would prefer to do the shopping on your own, or make a contribution of an item on a child's wish list, please let Linda Marzullo know. # **Church Business**

Annual Meeting, Pt. 1 - Nov. 17, 2024

The meeting will be in the Parish Hall, following the 9:30 worship service. On the agenda: the 2025 Budget, Election of Council members, Endowment Committee members, and a couple more items.

# Council Meeting Highlights - Oct. 17, 2024

At the September meeting, the Council approved Donna Hinsbeek to replace Josh Bratt as a Council member for the remainder of the year. Josh is beginning an educational program in October, and his classes conflict with our meeting day and time.

The Parish Hall bathroom remodel to become wheelchair accessible is nearly finished. It also includes a changing table that can be opened out from the wall. New shelving near the hot water heater and modifications to some kitchen cabinetry will compensate for storage that we lost in the pantry due to the bathroom expansion.

Security cameras have been installed in the sanctuary, Parish Hall, Fireside Room and kitchen. With the exception of the sanctuary, they do not run during preschool hours. Security film will not be reviewed unless there is a reason to do so, and camera video film will continually be erased after two weeks.

The Council approved motions from the Endowment Committee to award \$1,000 scholarships to Livier Brown and Josh Bratt. They are both pursuing M.A.s in Clinical Psychology at Antioch University in Santa Barbara beginning in October.

The Council also approved the Endowment Committee's motion to give \$1,000 to Iglesia San Juan Bautista (formerly Iglesia Luterana San Juan Baptista) in Santa Maria. The Congregation voted last February to continue support in 2024 and to review their situation at the Congregational Meeting in November. That church has now left the ELCA and is receiving support from the North American Lutheran Church and Missouri Synod Lutheran churches on the Central Coast.

If you haven't already done so, please review the proposed 2025 budget before the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, Nov. 17. You can contact Leigh Berenger, Jan Zigler or Carol Skoog before then with your questions and comments.
