Pastor Chris's Message

Brown Bag Packing - April 6

Our next Brown Bag Breakfast packing day will be held on April 6th. Help out at the coffee hour after the 9:30 service and make a difference in local seniors' lives! Even if you just have time to pack a few bags, your help makes it possible for us to meet the monthly needs of local seniors.

These bags provide food items to seniors who need to take medication with food. Many of them cannot afford this additional cost in their budgets. They also receive a few extra items so that they have snacks if needed.

What is happening with Federal Funding cuts to Food Programs?

Bethania Tuesday Food Distribution has been in operation for over 5 years, beginning in March 2020 when the COVID shutdown occurred. While this is a major accomplishment, it is also a sad fact that we still need to provide food to so many people who are not able to do so for themselves.

With the recent cuts to federal funding and USDA food allocation programs, including a freeze on The Emergency Food Assistance Program and cancellation of federal contracts with local produce growers connected to the SB Food Bank, it is paramount that additional support be given to keep our local families healthy. BTFD will need to purchase and secure more food than ever in order to meet the needs of our local families. A shocking statistic is that Santa Barbara County has the second highest poverty level among all of California's 58 counties.

The number of households currently receiving food assistance at BTFD has skyrocketed from an average of 180 per week at the end of 2024, to the current 280 per week. We anticipate with the cuts to federal programs, including school lunches, SNAP (food stamps), and other food assistance programs, that our numbers will rise again.

Being a 100% volunteer organization, every penny donated goes towards the purchase of food and program needs, including specialized food for our most vulnerable clients, infants and the elderly. This means that every dollar contributed to program needs is spent on providing food to those who need help.

A typical cross-section of the residents served includes: single residents, single parent families, intact families with children, new arrivals to the Valley (some of whom are refugees fleeing violence and persecution in their own countries and may be undocumented), migratory workers, the elderly (our oldest client is now 94 years old), the disabled, and the unhoused. BTFD serves people of all faiths, backgrounds, and races. The ages of BTFD clients are also a broad range, from teenagers to the elderly.

The majority of our clients are working in service industry jobs. These are the people who clean the hotels, work in our restaurants, pick our food, and provide basic services that keep our economy and our standard of living for our tourism customers and those living here in the Santa Ynez Valley at a quality level. All share the all-too-common reality of food insecurity. At the Bethania program, the only criterion for recipients is that they meet the LMI household guidelines. Clients are served without discrimination.

Tuesdays, come rain or shine, starting at 9 AM, volunteers start packing grocery bags with basic household items such as canned vegetables, beans and rice, cereal, peanut butter, pasta, bread, and quite often bags will include a canned protein.

By 1:30 PM, a Santa Barbara Food Bank truck delivers additional items for the grocery bags: fresh produce, or on occasion, dairy products and meat. Volunteers again step in to add the additional items to the grocery bags: bag the produce, and prepare pallets of items for the evening's distribution.

Often hours before distribution starts, people are assembling in two lines. They are either in their cars, wrapped around the block (drive-up), or lining up in person in front of Bethania Church (walk-up), bring their own wagons or having parked their cars in the parking lot.

Distribution begins at 5:15 for both lines. People are checked in and the week's food items are loaded into the awaiting car line (drive-up), or the wagons or parked cars (walk-up).

Volunteers do all the loading into cars, wagons, electric carts, etc. We offer special accommodations to clients who have disabilities and scheduling issues, as well as providing specialized food and protein supplements for clients who have specific needs.

Bethania Tuesday Food Distribution (BTFD) is by far the largest agency provider of food in the area as measured by numbers of people served monthly and the tonnage of food handed out. We only and always distribute on Tuesday so as not to conflict with other feeding programs. The hours of our program were designed to assist clients who are working and still need food assistance, as many of the food programs only distribute during the work day. We collaborate with People Helping People whenever possible to avoid duplication of services.

We differ from other programs in that we also supply baby food, baby formula, Ensure and other protein supplements, specialty food items for those with specific needs, and other items requested by our participants.

I am thankful that we are able to do so and help so many people who need assistance. With the new cuts to federal funding and the ending of other federal programs, we will need to be more diligent in finding funds so that we do not let these households fall even more into poverty. The news is that Food Bank is struggling to figure out how to cope, and many other food distributions are simply closing down.

My prayer is that all of you are thankful that we can do this for others. I especially send prayers of gratitude for our wonderful volunteers and donors who help us do this work.

- The Blessing Box has helped hundreds of people "get by" by being stocked daily with food items.
