Normal is Heaven

You probably would not like to be called normal. Especially in our society today, we seem to be more interested in coming off as extraordinary. We like to highlight the unique places we travel, the new clothes or cars we have, or the wonderful experiences we go through. Rarely does someone regularly share the normal, everyday things they go through day in and day out.

Concurrent to this, we've taken our faith and made it extraordinary as well. An example would be the ideas of heaven we've conjured up as a society. We think of mansions, abundance of wealth, abundance of our favorite things, extraordinary experiences, etc. I had a preschool teacher who told our preschool class that her dad's favorite thing was potato skins, and he believed everything in heaven was made of potato skins.

However, when we look at where most of the stories are centered throughout the Bible, especially the stories that are centered around the story of Jesus, there may be extraordinary moments in the works and words of Jesus and the various figures of the Bible, but they are take place in the most ordinary of places. A common tribe among other common tribes, among the ordinary masses of people, dealing with the day in day out circumstances of their lives. These are stories are meant to highlight the experiences of everyday people and point to the gifts that exist in these very accessible spaces.

I share this to say that we've just come out of the extraordinary time of Lent and Easter, which happen only a few weeks after the conclusion of Advent and Christmas. These are seasons of a lot of activity, especially on the church calendar. Our community in Lent and Easter have come together to make soup, salad and bread, to join in fellowship over a meal once a week, to bring our creativity together to decorate the church, to bring musical talents together to create an extraordinary service centered around the extraordinary moment of Christ's death and resurrection. There is hustle and bustle and it feels amazing.

And then the Church calendar moves into "ordinary time"—a time without a lot of church celebrations, where the stories focus on the everyday moments in Jesus and others lives. Things kind of calm down in the liturgy and in the calendar. But it is in these ordinary spaces that people gather, maybe over dinner or BBQs, average days might turn into trips to the beach, birthday parties are celebrated by friends and loved ones, people bump into each other with smiles at grocery stores or running errands, and people continue to gather as a community at church on Sundays. The normal

may not be talked about or planned for with the same gusto as the extraordinary, but it's where life happens. These spaces may be ordinary, but if we can be present in them, they end up being heaven because they are full of the people, the love, the support, and the community that our faith so regularly points to.

As we come out of this extraordinary time of the death and resurrection of Jesus and enter back into the normalcy of our daily routines, of summer weather, of running errands and moving through the day in and day out, embrace the normal. Embrace the people you get to spend time with, the ones you bump into, the ongoing ways of sharing God's love with those who need it. Embrace what each day brings because heaven is present in each of them.

- Pudding (non-refrigerated)

Noisy Sunday: Let's Help Moms!



The next "Noisy Sunday" is coming on May 25th.

Noisy Offering donations received that day will be used to purchase diapers, diaper rash cream, powdered formula and baby food to give out at our weekly food distribution.

Consider this offering another way to honor the mothers around us!

What will our donations be used towards?

Donations on Noisy Sunday will be used to purchase items to help struggling families keep their babies healthy, clean, fed and nurtured. For many of these families, finding funds to purchase diapers and formula are a

struggle. Depending on which style of diaper, a good range to estimate for a monthly disposable diaper budget is between \$150-275 per month. The average monthly cost for powdered formula for babies is \$100 to \$400 a month. Specialty formulas, such as those that contain hydrolyzed proteins, may cost even more.

We all really "make change for the better" with the Noisy Sunday! So bring your coins and make some noise to help celebrate mothers and their hard but rewarding work. Together, we can CHANGE a mother's – and a child's - world!
