I Need Your Help!

More and more hopeful information is coming out about the future of churches and there are 2 pieces of encouragement I'd like to share with you all. The first is from a Pew Research poll that came out recently showing the hemorrhaging of church membership across the board has stopped. Church member across the denominational line has been declining for the last 20 years and it's been an extremely worrying trend, but according to Pew, the decline has finally stopped. Second, and this isn't just from Pew, but more importantly from Barna, which is a research group that focuses solely on churches, people are looking for what churches should be offering. The "should" in that sentence is important.

I've shared this before, but people, especially today, are desiring the values of Jesus. They are looking for community, belonging, and spaces where they can feel and share the love of God, especially in action towards those who are in need. They are looking for what we've been offering for decades, and I find this incredibly hopeful because at our core, this is who Bethania is.

I hope you've noticed over the last few months we've had a lot of new people coming to check out our church community. These aren't folks who simply just moved to the area and are looking for the local Lutheran Church, but people who have been here for years and have noticed our values out on display, through our gatherings and through our ministry, and have decided to check us out. However, it's sometimes daunting walking into a space with people you don't know and being part of a service you haven't experienced before. So to that end I'd really like to ask for your help.

As I said, visitors come in and they don't know anyone. But you also don't know if a visitor is there as a tourist checking out the service that day, or if they have been coming for a few weeks. It's daunting for them, but it's also daunting for you not knowing what their story is. However, I have a pretty good idea of who is coming to check us out and who is just visiting. To that end, I would like to do a better job myself, of highlighting people at the beginning of the service. We have several families that have been coming for a few weeks to a few months, and I would love to highlight them in particular, but I also would like to make this a regular part of our service.

Now this is where you all come in. When a new person or family is introduced during the service, I would love for you to just be your welcoming selves. Either during the greetings we do during the service or after the service is over, please make sure to go and say hello, welcome them to Bethania, invite them to join you for coffee, and/or introduce them to the community members you regularly interact with and help them feel right at home. If you plan on going to any of our upcoming events, like quilting, BLCW, potlucks, etc. let them know about it and invite them to come along. I know we all have our own comfort levels, so do what feels comfortable to you.

We have an amazing church with the kind of lived-out values that a lot of people are looking for, but the scariest part for a visitor is right at the beginning coming into an unfamiliar space with unfamiliar people. Receiving a warm welcome from not just the pastor, but the community is one of the best ways to help them discover all the amazing things we do. So be ready! I plan on creating more of these welcoming avenues starting in the next couple of weeks and I'm going to rely on you to just be yourself and make these new folks feel like they're already part of our community!

Piece Makers

In June Jan Zigler and Lois De Meyer were invited to Bethany Lutheran in Lompoc to meet their quilting group. They meet every Tuesday and make quilts for several organizations. They are very generous and gave us lots of fabric that will be good for quilt tops and back. We learned a new technique they called stringing. On June 20, we added a quilting day. We tried the stringing method and it is faster. Four quilts were completed. That brings our totals to 28 completed quilts, 5 quilts waiting for binding and 21 tops and backs waiting to be tied. We really hope to reach our goal of 50 quilts this year.

In July we will be meeting July 11, 18 and/or 25. Let us know if you will be able to join us so we have enough tables set up.

Noisy Sunday, July 27th: Items for Kits

The next "Noisy Sunday" is coming on July 27th. Our "joyful noise" will be helping to send a child to school. In many countries, the family must provide all the items needed to attend school: paper, ruler, pencils, pens, etc.

It is incredible to think about how we can change someone's life by providing pens, pencils and paper. Or, how we can help someone keep healthy by providing a bar of soap and a towel. These are small things that add up to a much larger picture. When we collect the items for completing our Day of Service kits, each kit we complete helps someone who is struggling with their daily challenges.

We have started collecting the items below, and will purchase more items from any "Noisy Sunday" or designated donations we receive. If you would like to donate items, you may purchase them and drop them in the narthex, deliver to church office, or contact Linda Marzullo for pick up (805-688-5219, vikingpressprint@verizon.net).

The completed kits will be distributed globally by Lutheran World Relief to areas most in need. This also includes areas of the U.S. (We will be packing them on our Day of Service Event in September. Watch for more info.)

Items needed are:

For Personal Care Kits:

- 1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
- 2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping 2 per kit)
- 3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
- 4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
- 5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

For School Supply Kits:

- 1. 70 sheet College ruled Notebooks (spiral bound)
- 2. Rulers with centimeters and inches
- 3. Pencil sharpeners
- 4. Blunt tip scissors
- 5. #2 Pencils NOT SHARPENED please!
- 6. Ballpoint (not gel) Pens, Black or Blue ink
- 7. 2-1/2" Erasers
- 8. Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count)

Food Distribution and Blessing Box

With the Food Distribution closed for a week at the end of June due to VBS, our volunteers are getting a much-needed break. Numbers for food assistance are over 250 households weekly. Our volunteers work hard, packing food and getting it out to people in need. We purchase items every week since Food Bank is only giving us USDA once a month. So, we are spending more money and feeding more people with less help from the Food Bank.

The Blessing Box always needs items – but right now, consider donating items that do not have to be cooked on a stove or can be heated easily in a microwave. Or, donate some items for our pantry so we have things available when the need comes up. Someone out there can use a "blessing" from Bethania – and we never know who will need help.

Bethania continues operating as a Food Distribution site every Tuesday from 5:15-6:45 pm. We will be back to work on July 1st. If you would like to help on a Tuesday, please contact me. We appreciate and value every volunteer who assists us with this monumental task and cannot thank them enough. Our Tuesdays are split into three shifts, with the morning crew coming in at 9:00 to pack bags, unloaders and produce packers around 1:15 – and USDA packers on the last week of the month. Distribution helpers come around 4:45 for the evening distribution. Clean up helpers are always welcome at the end of the night.

We continue to need your prayers and support for this mission, which is making a difference in so many lives here in our area.

Church Business

Council Meeting Highlights

At the June Council meeting, it was noted that outside parties renting the Parish Hall have consistently not been following the rules of the rental agreement and have caused damage to our premises. For this reason, we will no longer be renting out the Parish Hall to outside parties. The Hall is still available for rental to church members, of course.

Because the stage curtain is likely to be used much less than before, the Council decided not to spend the \$13,000 required to replace it. A better use of that money, it seems to us, is to put it toward dual paned windows in the Fireside Room, the Parish Hall, and the kitchen. We are looking into the cost of that improvement.

The parts for the repair of the pipe organ are on their way from Germany, and the repairs are still scheduled to take place in August.
