Each week there will be something new, so don't forget to stop by on your way to coffee or to Unorthodox.

Anyone can donate to the table. "Shoppers" take what you want and donate whatever amount you choose. All funds raised at the Produce Table will be used to keep our Blessing Box in front of the church stocked, and to help with food distribution program needs.



Instead of garden or fruit tree bounty going to waste, offer to take excess produce off your neighbor's hands, and bring the items to the table!

Other ways to help:

Personal Care & School Supply Kit Items Needed!

We will be collecting items this summer for the "DAY OF SERVICE" on Sept. 14th when we assemble Personal Care Kits and School Supplies for Lutheran World Relief.

You can help people dealing with some of life's most difficult situations –the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing home to escape violence, and living in extreme poverty. When LWR distributes **Personal Care Kits**, it's often to people who have lost everything. Natural disasters such as earthquakes and refugee camps are typical distribution areas for these kits. Around the world people suffer each day because of lack of basic hygiene. In refugee camps, after natural disasters, and in the world's poorest communities, a few simple items can mean the difference between sickness and health, and life and death.

Why school supplies? Imagine having to choose between a meal or purchasing a notebook. To the children who receive **School Kits**, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford. And when parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority...yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Here are the items we are collecting. Watch for sales this summer!

Items needed are:

For Personal Care Kits:

- 1. Bath size towels (light to medium weight, between 20"x40" & 27"x52"), dark colors preferred
- 2. Bars of soap (4-5 oz., any brand, in original wrapping 2 per kit)
- 3. Toothbrush (adult size, in original packaging bulk buys can be repackaged by us)
- 4. Comb, sturdy wide toothed
- 5. Nail clippers (with or without nail files)

For School Supply Kits:

- 1. Pencil sharpeners We have enough, thank you!
- 2. Blunt tip scissors We have enough, thank you!
- 3. Notebooks We have enough, thank you!
- 4. #2 Pencils unsharpened
- 5. Blue or Black ink pens no gel pens, please
- 6. Rulers (plastic or wood, no metal edge) with inches and centimeters
- 7. 2-1/2" Erasers We have enough, thank you!
- 8. Box of Crayons (16 or 24 count) We have enough, thank you!
- 9. Small Rubber Bands to band up bundles of pens and pencils


