Why Do We Wait?

Lately, I've been ruminating about several different feelings that keep being affirmed. As I navigate my own anxious feelings about how fast life moves, how quickly the girls are growing, the deep polarization we're experiencing in society, the heightened levels at which people are looking at screens and being informed by social media, the changing landscape of the Church in general and how that affects Bethania in particular, I keep coming back to three calls on my life: 1) the physical communities I get to be part of, 2) the calm, simple requirements it takes to be part of these communities, and 3) making the commitment to invest in the time and energy to meet these requirements are the constant balm in this fast-paced, technologically driven world.

I'm sure this might invoke some eye-rolls (I know when people younger than me complain about stuff I've already been through, my immediate response is to roll my eyes and say, "Just wait"), but life moves too fast and the temptation to be distracted from the life in front of me seems to be getting more efficient. Digital worlds are becoming so compelling and intentionally fast-paced, and the mundane, routine moments of life are becoming easier to escape. I don't have to just sit in a waiting room, watch commercials or ads, sit uncomfortably with writer's block, etc. I can just whip at my phone and escape.

However, amid all this chaos, there have been several experiences that don't tolerate escape. I've done a lot of funerals in the last 8 weeks. I've sat with people in their last moments and families during their grief, I've listened to stories of their loved ones and watched the impossible mixture of laughter and tears only grief can bring on. There are no distractions in these moments, no method of moving through them in a fast-paced way, just the raw experience of time, quietness, heartache, and love. No matter how engaged any of us are with technology, no matter how tempted we can be to escape from the mundane and the routine, we will all have these moments where we have to be present. And in those moments, the walls come down, love and gratitude come pouring out, and all the stuff we were afraid to say suddenly doesn't carry the weight of our fear. I feel called to these spaces because they get to the essence of what it is to be human, and they remind me that what makes us feel the most worthwhile and fulfilled and loved are in these spaces.

What strikes me is always the question, "Why do we wait?" Why do we wait for the last moments for the walls come down and the fear to dissipate? Why do we wait for time to be so short, when time is truly such a gift we take for granted? The world vies for our attention and it's getting

better. Screens, social media, AI, pocket computers, substances, accessibility, it's all getting more efficient and it vies for our attention and our resources.

But around all of us are the physical communities we get to be a part of and the simple requirements it takes to be a part of them. As we enter this season of remembering the Saints, of gratitude, of welcoming Christ among us, I feel more and more called to the simple things around me I already have access to: my community, my friends, my wife, my children, and this calling of God to just be present in them. Outwardly it might seem mundane or slow-paced, but I've found when I sit with people in their last moments and with their loved ones and we share stories of their life and what we'll remember and cherish, they are all centered in these spaces. And we don't have to wait until those spaces are in our rearview mirror, we don't have to wait until it's too late to be with the people we love, to share the gratitude and love in our heart, or to feel the worthwhile joy that comes from love and gratitude expressed to us. We don't have to wait. It's around us and it's abundant.

Theo Pub




