Bethania's Mission Statement

We are a community of Christ-centered, welcoming, inclusive and multi-generational people rooted in God's faith, hope and love, called to advocate for justice, give to those in need, and share God's affirming love with the world.

A Small But Mighty Church...

I've been the pastor at Bethania for 10 years now and we're going to do something this year that happens at many churches but hasn't happened in my time here: we're going to have a stewardship campaign. We have a lot of folks who've joined Bethania in the last few years, and a stewardship campaign is simply a reminder of the financial side of our church. So whether you're a regular attendee or haven't been in a while or only watch online, I would ask that you please read through this article to the end and please search your heart.

First and foremost, I would ask that people always remember, giving should be done with a cheerful heart. At no point in time should shame or guilt be a part of why anyone gives, but rather joy, hope, and community. As Paul says in his 2nd letter to the Corinthians, "Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not regretfully or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." My hope always is that Bethania instills within each of us a desire to give.

Bethania is a small, but mighty church, which is quite evident from all the community activities we have here throughout the year. However, unlike most non-profits, Bethania relies entirely on the giving of its community members, and every donation, from small to large, means a lot. These donations cover the cost of basics such as our utilities and salaries, but they also make up the foundation upon which all our church activities can happen. My ultimate hope is that you experience the joy of those activities and find them a worthy reason for which to give.

I would like to share it plainly for us all to see how much any help matters. At Bethania we have 304 unique givers. This could be an individual or an entire household. Of those 304 givers, 197 give less than \$100 a year, and 20 give less than \$199 a year. Let me be clear, no one should feel guilty about what they can give, but my hope is that those who are able, might consider increasing what they give to Bethania. Even if a small percentage of those 217 givers were able to give a little more, it would be a huge help to our small church. It would enable us to think less about how we're going to pay the bills and more about how we can be creative with our ministries.

There used to be a time where people just went to church on Sunday. Additionally, giving to church was not just a regular activity, but an oft discussed activity. Churches talked about tithing and stewardship and giving as a first-fruit of income. Today, churches have to be creatively engaging in

how they invite people to participate, and it is no longer a given that folks just come to church on Sunday because it's the routine. We've been doing a really good job of this at Bethania and I'm so grateful for our church growth. I also absolutely hate talking about money. Because of that, I'm sure there are plenty of missed opportunities in reminding people that Bethania relies solely on member donations and also missed opportunities in sharing how we think about giving.

One member recently said it best: At their previous church giving was thought about as tithing vs. tipping. A tip is often something given after a service is rendered and it's usually in the moment. A tithe, however, asks a person to consider their income as a whole and their relationship with God and wealth. A tithe can be an action of gratitude—we give because we are blessed; or it can be an action of faith—God will do something with that money beyond our comprehension. A tithe is a point of reflection for each of us on our own spirituality and how that intersects with the world around us.

One perspective that was discussed a lot when I was growing up, but I have neglected to share in my time as pastor is tithing as a percentage of income rather than a momentary dollar amount. The word tithe literally means tenth. I completely understand that in expanding costs of living a tenth of one's income is unsustainable for a majority of people. Statistically speaking the average church donation throughout the country is 2% of a person's income. If that number rose to 4%, small churches like our own would be sustainable for the foreseeable future on member donations alone.

So, this stewardship campaign will simply be reminders, and the conversations this campaign will ask you to have will only be with yourself. We would ask you to consider a percentage of your income as a regular donation amount. If you're giving very little and you are able to raise that to 1%, that would be amazing. If you're giving 2% and you're able to raise that to 4%, that would be amazing. If you're giving 4% and you're able to raise that to 10%, that would be amazing. Again, it's a conversation you have with yourself and no one else. I also want to point out in case I haven't before, as pastor I maintain a personal policy not to know, nor seek out what any church member gives. It's part of my ongoing desire to treat everyone equally and I don't look at individual member offerings; neither does council. So this conversation would truly be with yourself, and I hope the bottom line is always that you give only with a cheerful heart.

This stewardship campaign will start in the middle of October and run through the middle of November. At the end of it, we will have a short service during our 9:30 worship in which we will ask everyone to consider what they give for the 2026 year, put that number in an envelope, and we will place those envelopes on the altar. At the conclusion of the service, we will take the envelopes outside and burn them as an offering to God. Neither I, nor anyone else but you will know what is written in those envelopes and this will be a personal commitment you make with yourself and with God. I know that times can feel uncertain, and I believe the church community and the ways we are present in this world can be one of the best balms for that uncertainty. Your donations to Bethania, in time, energy, and resources are what enable us to continue to be that balm, and that enduring reminder of God's presence, strength, and love, so from the bottom of my heart, thank you for whatever you choose to give.
