Just Be...

I came across a quote last week from author Robin Meyers' book Saving God from Church, that said, "In the sermon on the mount, there is not a single word about what to believe, only words about what to do and how to be. By the time the Nicene Creed is written, only three centuries later, there is not a single word in it about what to do and how to be—only words about what to believe." The sermon on the mount opens with the Beatitudes, which we hear the first Sunday in February this year. The Beatitudes are a powerful opening to this famous sermon by Jesus about who God sees amidst the history of the world, and I find myself dwelling on this above quote, the Sermon on the Mount, and the Beatitudes as we get ready to go through the journey of Lent this year.

The Beatitudes are my favorite verses within the entire Bible and I've often thought if had to pick one part of the Bible to keep with me it would be the Beatitudes, and now in the midst of the turmoil we're experiencing around us, I find myself thinking, maybe the Beatitudes should be the only part of the Bible Christians focus on. I think of it this way: the Sermon on the Mount is the first sermon of Jesus' public ministry. It's the first time he's speaking in front of crowds that would make up the future church. And what does Jesus choose to share? It's not doctrine, dogma, it's not who's in or who's out, it's not a call to arms, which a lot of people were hoping for—rather it's about love. It's how people, regardless of their place in life, can choose to love one another, choose forgiveness and compassion, can choose to live in community with people who are different than they are because they choose to see God in those around them. And in this famous sermon, Jesus did not intend for people to consider this way of life, he directed them to live it out. This was Jesus' first sermon, and he did not preach it, he then went out and lived it; lived it so radically, he was put to death because of it. But he created such transformation in the time he was on earth, that a whole host of people who followed him into that way of life were able to carry on the mantle, something Jesus always intended.

Our faith is really easy. We've just complicated it. We've complicated it with words, with dogma and doctrine. We've complicated it by turning it into a faith that lives in our mind and intellect rather than our hearts and our deeds. And yet, even in all the complications, there is the Sermon on the Mount, as explicit as can be, calling us to love each other, to care for one another, calling us to kindness, and calling us to care for the least of these. Perhaps for Lent this year, we can make it easy on ourselves.

Without deep, intellectual reflection, without spaces of long devotion, what if we just chose the daily actions of love that are not just at the center of this famous sermon, but at the center of our faith. What if our intentionality this time went into the daily opportunities that cross our path to be kind to one another, to show compassion to those who need it most, to just let go of the ways that our intellect can become traps to our faith, and instead... Just. Be. Followers. Of. Jesus.

Church Business

Council Highlights - Jan. 25, 2026

We have so much to be thankful for at Bethania: the largest giving month ever in December, eleven new members in January, and the imminent expansion of our Food Distribution outreach.

I am thankful to Coastal Valleys Roofing for rushing out to put a tarp over the leak in the roof over the Fireside Room, and then a second one, to stop water intrusion during the Christmas storms. They fixed that leak as soon as the rains stopped.

I am especially thankful for the Endowment Fund. They are, in part, our saving for a rainy day. The Endowment Committee has recently voted to pay for reroofing the parsonage and garage, as well as the church office. Additionally, the fund will pay for half of the preschool's new fence around the play yard which was damaged in the recent storms. How would we fund these much-needed projects without the Endowment Fund? I suspect that we couldn't. Please consider remembering the Endowment Fund in your legacy giving.

Part II of the church's annual meeting is held each February. This year it will be on **Feb. 22 at 10:45 am** in the Parish Hall.

At that meeting, we will choose a new Nominating Committee, as well as two representatives to the synod convention in early summer. The bulk of the discussion, however, will probably be the 2025 Annual Report. Committee and ministry chairs will be on hand to hear comments and answer questions about their sections of the report.
